Haunted Houses, Frankenstein, Scarecrows, Sugar Skulls, Owls, Haybales, Masks, and more.




Fan Favorites are specific projects that the public can vote on. Winners of the Fan Favorites win additional prizes

The 4-H Teen Council Club participates in an interstate exchange with another club in the country. These two-year exchanges allow kids to see other parts of the country, meet new kids, learn about history, see interesting sites, try new foods and make lasting friendships!

The 2022/2023 exchange was with Simpson County, Kentucky. In July 2022, 13 Oneida County teens boarded a plane and flew to Nashville, TN where they were met by some parents of the Simpson County 4-H club who transported them to Franklin, Kentucky. New York teens were paired up with Kentucky teens and spent the first day getting to know each other at a picnic. That night, the New York teens went back to the Kentucky teens homes for the night. The rest of the week was spent doing fun activities including visiting the Country Music Hall of Fame in Nashville along with a golf cart tour of the city. They visited Louisville Kentucky where they toured Churchill Downs and the Louisville Slugger Bat Factory. In Bowling Green Kentucky, it was the Corvette Museum and a cheese tasting at Western Kentucky University. Mixed in throughout the week were other fun activities including a drive-in movie, bowling, swimming, and tubing.

In July 2023, those same Kentucky teens came to Oneida County, where everyone was very excited to be reunited with their friends! Oneida County teens got to showcase New York State by taking the group to Niagara Falls, Cornell University, Water Safari and toured local agricultural businesses. Never in a million years did the Kentucky kids think the highlight of the week would be when they had their arm shoulder-deep into the stomach of cow! Other highlights of the week included a hike up Bald Mountain, a hike through Treman Park in Ithaca, eating CNY featured foods, playing volleyball and swimming.







### What is WHEP?

The WHEP (National Wildlife Habitat Education Program) is a hands-on environmental education program. WHEP also provides participants an opportunity to test their wildlife knowledge in a friendly competition, as each state supporting WHEP conducts an annual contest where teams of 3-4 similarly aged individuals gather. The winning senior (14-19 years of age) WHEP team from each state earns the right to attend the annual National WHEP Contest, typically held the last full week of July. The national contest moves to a different state each year.

WHEP is a 4-H and FFA youth natural resource program dedicated to teaching wildlife and fisheries habitat management to junior and senior level (ages 8-19) youth in the United States.
