Entrepreneurship Club

Starting January of 2024, Agricultural Educator Jacob Maslyn will be leading a group of high school age kids in an Entrepreneurship club where they will learn what it means to own a business. In this club kids will understand what it means to be an entrepreneur, their role in the community. How you take an idea and turn it into a business, how they could get funding to start a business. Kids will be tasked with writing a business plan and presenting it at the Ontario County fair for a competition.

This club is anticipated to go once a month from January to July with the last few months focused working on a project that the kids will be judged upon at the Ontario County fair.

January 15th – What is an entrepreneur? Who are they in the community? Why do we need them?

February 19th – How do we come up with a good business idea? Where can I get funding to do this? Is there a market for this idea, and how will I expand my market?

March 27th – What is a business plan and how do I write one? How should I get estimates to put in my business plan? Who will look at my business plan? We will talk with ag professionals about what makes a good business plan.

April 17th – We will have a panel of local entrepreneurs tell us about how they started and their experiences.

May "TBT" - Working on our business plans, and business. Tour of a local farming operation.

June "TBT" - Working on our business plans, and business. Tour of a local farming operation.

July 26th – Presentation of our final business plan at the county fair. Prizes will be made available to the winners.


Beginner Public Presentation Training

Earn While you Learn - Animal Science Apprentice Program

December 18, 2023 (12:00 PM-1:00 PM ET)

This free one-hour webinar will detail the ins and outs of the Animal Science Apprentice Program.

Program apprentices are hired to work full-time by a partnering employer. In addition to hourly wages, participants will receive 147 hours of industry-specific training along with quarterly wage increases for the first year. The first ASAP class is scheduled to begin in February 2024. We will accept applications for the program during the webinar.

Earn While You Learn - Animal Science Apprentice Program will provide an overview of the Penn State Extension Animal Science Apprentice Program (ASAP). This program is designed for high school graduates (18 or older) looking to enter the workforce or for adults of any age looking to make a career change to livestock production. If you are interested in working with animals and developing skills to create a fulfilling career in the animal science industry, then this might be the opportunity you are looking for.

The National Livestock Expo Educational Contests

The Ontario 4-H Livestock Program is proud to announce that this year they had three 4-H members participate in the Livestock Skillathon contest at the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Kentucky. This year the Skillathon contest had 22 state teams from across the country participate, the largest number of teams ever.

The Livestock Skillathon contest consisted of both individual and team guestions. The team had to answer questions on quality assurance, livestock nutrition and animal performance and marketing. For the individual portion of the contest 4-H members had to participate in six stations including Hay evaluation, wool evaluation, Breeds of livestock, equipment used in the livestock industry, meat cut identification and a quality assurance problem. This year's 4-H Livestock Skillathon participants included Olivia Maslyn from Ontario County, Evelyn Kersmanc from Otsego County, Anikka Parshall from Ontario County and Wyatt Wadams from Ontario County. This year's team was coached by Amy Pyra from Ontario County. Congratulations to Evelyn on placing 6th high individual in Quality Assurance and to Annika on placing 10th high individual in Evaluation.
