

The January outing of the Ontario County Young Birds Club will be on Saturday, January 27, 2024. We will journey to Hobart College's Henry Hanley Biological Field Preserve on 3167 Leader Road, in Seneca Falls. The Preserve is a bit south of Canoga, NY. We will meet at the parking lot of Cayuga Lake State Park on lower lake road in Seneca Falls, NY at 10 am.

In some winters birds that regularly winter in Canada's boreal forests may visit upstate New York. Such movements of large numbers of birds south of their normal wintering grounds is called an irruption. Unlike normal bird migration which occurs in a seasonal, repeated, predictable way, irruptions are unpredictable. Ornithologists think these movements are, at least in part, a response to food shortages, such as a poor cone crop on coniferous trees in the wintering grounds of seed-eating birds or rodents. Seed crop failure in these northern regions spells disaster for seed-eating birds and the rodent populations that depend on them. These birds are forced to look elsewhere for food as are the birds of prey that prey on seed eating rodents. A good seed-producing year followed by a very prolific spring with lots of young birds, can also contribute to the occurrence of an irruption. Unusual birds commonly seen during an irruption year may include the following species: white-winged crossbill, red crossbill, pine grosbeak, evening grosbeak, common redpoll, pine siskin and bohemian waxwing.

Western Livestock Wranglers: For our November meeting the West-


