Volunteer Connections: This is an opportunity to tune up your skills well having dinner with like minded people. Public Presentations: This program helps youth learn to create a presentation and present it before an audience. They will learn to research, organize and use creative ideas to keep the audiences interest. Every year the youth grow and are challenged with a more difficult presentation the following year. Dairy Bowl: The 4-H Dairy Bowl program is designed to give 4-Hers the opportunity to learn and share their knowledge about Dairy Science. Interested youth get together weekly to learn about the dairy industry and have fun while doing it. The actual district event held in March is run very similar to a game show where there are teams, buzzers and a moderator.

Details you should know:

- 4-H membership is not required but all non-members will have to enroll for the current year. So invite your child's friends!
- You do not have to live on a dairy farm to participate!
- Weekly practices help youth prepare for the event typically scheduled for Sunday afternoons.
- There are 3 levels of team participation Beginners (first timers those who are 8 to 10 years of age as of 1/1/24), Juniors (9 to 13 years as of 1/1/24) and Seniors (14 years & older as of 1/1/24).
- We are looking for any interested youth to create teams to represent Washington County at the District Event!
- The Capital District Dairy Bowl is Saturday March 16 in Ballston Spa.

4-H Tractor Safety: Our Capital District 4-H Tractor Safety program is coming up this spring. The details are still in the works but the virtual orientation is **March 14** & the tours, demonstrations, & practice driving will be **April 1 - 3**. The Skills & Driving tests will be on **Saturday April 6**. This course is for youth 14 years and older. Once the participant passes the written, skills & driving tests, they will receive a certificate that allows them to be employed in an agricultural operation. 
Northern begins February 28; Southern tentatively begins March 2

National Safe Tractor & Machinery Operation Program

Youth* will:

- Learn essential safety skills
- Gain hands on experience with tractors & skid steers
- Earn their HOSTA safety certification once they pass the written, skills & tractor driving operation tests

*Youth 14 & 15 years old are required to have a NSTMOP certificate when employed on farms & at agribusinesses that include operating equipment. Youth participants must be at least 14 years old as of April 1; any youth 14—18 years are eligible for this program.

In person sessions:

Tours: April 1—3

Practice driving: April 3

Skills & Driving Tests: April 6

Homework & written test will be online.



Rooted In Paradise



Thanks for making such a huge impact on our community, we all appreciate the services you have provided!







