Auction Terms and Conditions

- Payment for all purchases must be made on the night of the auction. Cash or check only!
- We will honor arrangements made prior to the sale for payment after the auction. Please speak with a 4-H Livestock Auction Committee member and still check out after the auction. All purchases must be settled within 10 days!
- All payments will be made to: CCE Ontario
- All 4-H members receive proceeds from the sale of their animal. A nominal commission is collected from members to help defray auction and program expenses.
- All animals are sold live, by the pound with the exception for rabbits (live) and poultry which are already processed. Buyers may choose to send purchased animals to a packing plant, resell them via donating them back, resell them thru Canandaigua Stockyards or take them home.
- If you buy an animal and wish to donate it back to the 4-H Livestock Auction Program, please notify the auction staff as soon as it is purchased. Those animals will be resold and all proceeds from the resale will go to the Ontario County 4-H Livestock Auction Program.

- Following the auction, at cashing out, please indicate which processor you would like to process your animals. Space is limited depending on which processor you select.
- Free trucking will be provided for animals to our processors, courtesy of the 4-H Livestock Auction Committee.
- Due to the size of our auction, some animals may need to be held until the processor can accommodate them. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.
- The buyer is responsible for paying all slaughtering and processing fees. Prices are subject to change without prior notification.
