

Harvest Share brings together the local community and provides valuable work and volunteer opportunities for Schenectady County residents through sustainable agriculture.

How Harvest Share Works

Every Monday and Thursday from June to September, the Sustainable Living Center (SLC) Farm Stand is open from 12:00pm-4:00pm, where Harvest Share members receive locally grown vegetables, herbs, and flowers based on what is ready for harvest.

Over 100 varieties of produce are grown throughout the season. Options may include tomatoes, eggplants, beets, beans, cucumbers, carrots, radishes, peppers, scallions, summer squashes, leafy greens, herbs, and flowers.

Shares are harvested in the morning by Roots & Wisdom youth participants and are available for pickup at the Farm Stand. Additional produce can be purchased at the Farm Stand by Harvest Share members or the general public.
