



Family Mealtime Bingo

Did you know?

Research shows eating family meals together on a regular bases has a positive impact on the well-being of children & adolescents. Eating together as a family can:

- · Reduce child's risk of tobacco & substance abuse
- · Reduce eating disorders
- · Improve mental health
- · Bring families together

Quality Time & Quality Food

Make a colorful fruit salad instead of desert! Kids cut up the fruit. Pack a picnic! Have an indoor or outdoor family picnic!

Choose a dinner theme(Chinese, lite bites) Kids choose! Go on Pintrest and have kids pick a healthy new recipe. Make homemade pizza with healthy toppings.

Have a pajama party! Serve breakfast at dinner and wear PJs. Kids cook! Have the adults help the kids prepare a meal. Get fancy! Set the table, light candles and have name tents for everyone.

Try a smoothie instead of juice or pop.

Turn off technology. Eat dinner together with no cell phones or TV.

Swap seats with someone at the table. Then share

Set a goal to drink at least 5-8 glasses of water daily.

Free

Try a new vegetable for the first time. Save money by adding frozen fruit or vegetables into a recipe.

Ask each family member to come to dinner prepared to share a joke or funny story.

Blend fruit. Pour into ice cube trays. Add frozen cubes to water for a fruitinfused beverage. Shop for seasonal fruit & vegetables at a local farmer's market or grocery store.

Salad bar night! Everyone makes there own dinner salad Say no to regular, diet soda and energy drinks for 3 days.

Compare sugar content in a variety of beverages. Pledge to rethink your drink!

Make a recipe using beans in place of meat for a healthy alternative.

Make fruitinfused water in place of pop or iuice Invite a child or adult you know who often eats dinner alone. Add a powerhouse of nutrients with spinach or kale in a salad, casserole or recipe.

Quality time: When it comes to family mealtime, focus on quantity and quality. Put the phones away, turn off the TV and enjoy time together.



PLANNING AHEAD FOR THE SOLAR ECLIPSE



A solar eclipse is what happens when the **sun is blocked from view** - such as when the moon orbits between Earth and the sun.

While we are not organizing any 4-H events for the eclipse on April 8th, we are preparing for an interesting and memorable experience, and encourage you to learn more about it!

A note about safety: It is important to remember that it is unsafe to look directly at the sun without proper eye protection, and there are special "eclipse glasses" made specifically for viewing the sun during an eclipse; typical sunglasses are **not** sufficient. If you choose to view the eclipse next month, please take special precautions. You can read more about eye safety during an eclipse on <u>NASA's website</u>.



NYS 4-H VIRTUAL POULTRY JUDGING SERIES

MAY 8TH, 15TH AND 22ND

May 8th, 7 p.m. - Biology and Physiology of Production Hens

As hens move through their life phases, they experience a number of physiological shifts as their bodies prepare, sustain and eventually cease laying eggs. Learn what causes these changes and how to identify them. This information will be useful as students begin structuring their oral reasons.

May 15th, 7 p.m. - Handling Hens and Placing Classes

In this lesson, we'll use live examples of hens to review handling flighty birds and how to remove birds from cages. We'll also use examples of hens from red and white production strains to review how to place birds and how to back up those decisions with oral reasons.

May 22nd, 7 p.m. - Placing Classes Practice

Students will be given free online practice classes through livestockjudging.com to score and provide oral reasons on their own. This week's lesson will review the answers to those practice classes, provide the explanation as to why the classes were placed that way, and provide the opportunity for students to get their questions answered.
