Approval of Minutes. Jeff Miller proposed a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the May 22 meeting as presented. Chad Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried: 10 ayes, 0 nays.

<u>Finance Committee report</u> given by George Haffenden and Darcy Cramer.

Cash position seems to be fantastic. SNAP funding coming in, animal sale numbers coming in well also, closer in line to where they are historically. Payouts are typical Cornell expenses. Carryover discussions regarding setting up new accounts and credit cards, leftover from July meeting. Assets just over \$1,000,000. Four or five ARPA projects finished up, waiting on final reports to request payment from the County. CCE-C pays farmer, then county pays CCE-C Patty Benton Proposed a motion to accept the financials pending annual review, Alyssa Porter seconded the motion. Motion carried: 11 ayes, 0 nays.

Executive Director's presentation given by Emily Reynolds (attached).

- Met with CHQ County planning department, requested \$18,000 increase, talked to legislature to let them know. Preliminary budget released Wednesday, then meets to discuss.
- Received New York Food for NY Families grant, can use until August 2025, to purchase local food and distribute to community with no strings attached. Will be hiring food systems resource educator to administrate. This person will be looking for additional funding as well to sustain support for this position. Plans to use reserve funds to support this position also. Job description at Cornell campus for approval, hoping to start January 1. Four distribution sites, Briggiotta's staging area and distribution, Jamestown Mobile Market food truck will transport, Jamestown Office of the Aging, Dunkirk Salvation Army, Sherman site TBA. Also included are freezer purchases to support meat & dairy included in distribution. Purchases must be from NYS. Has to be USDA inspected and approved for resale. Briggiotta's already doing the tracking to ensure it's all coming from NYS. CCE-C will invoice after distribution.
- SNAP grant for next 5 years approved.
- Ag in the Classroom 4H position: 8 candidates
- Rose Clark will start as ag coordinator on October 5
- New EFNEP proposal 1 year extension, also approved for further extension if needed. Challenges are getting people to sign up and to complete. Have funding through end of 2024, hoping to apply for the next 5 years. CCE-C has two EFNEP educators currently.
- Fundraiser with 4H: selling box of apples for \$20 from Briggiotta's.
- Candy bar fundraisers through end of October for 4H.
- Chris Watkins was removed as director of Cornell Cooperative Extension. New director's name is Jenny Kao-Kaniffen.
- Annual meeting October 18 at 6pm at Clarion Hotel in Dunkirk
- Hired regional climate specialist, grant through NYSERTA working with PUSH Buffalo
- Went to listening forum on Farm Bill, with Langworthy, and heard chairman of ag committee GT Thompson. (Ron) many spoke on need to increase budget for ag research and education (CCE programs), goal to increase from 2% to 4%.
- Tour highlight CCE-C working with CHQ County, followed Hungarian hot pepper farming through to Crunch Roll production. Showed from field to consumer.

 Manufactured in Westfield. Selling at over 1,000 retail locations. Demonstrating that farming connects directly to manufacturing. ~53 people took the tour.

Legislative Report

• County legislature supportive of increased funding for CCE-C efforts. Emily does not know if it's in the budget yet, described and clarified process.

• John – last month extended term of bed tax

 - o Job corps garden club still up and going, came to demo garden at JCC
 - Had volunteers at Open Barn Door
 - Optimistic Gardener publication coming out featuring harmful plants
 - Meeting with head of B&G at JCC, new site selection for demo garden in front of science building. Proposal sent to JCC Board.
 - Hosted garden symposium that discussed better way of planting, various talks and displays, had door prizes
