#### **Animal Science Members**

#### Re-Enrollment for returning members closed on 1/5/24

- Returning/Re-enrolling members needed to re-enroll by January 5, 2024, to be eligible to show/ exhibit animals at the 2024 Niagara County Fair. Re-enrollments received between January 6, 2024-March 1, 2024, can still participate in 4-H and attend all animal meetings & 4-H programs, but are not permitted to show animals at fair in 2024.
- First time enrolling/new members must enroll by March 1, 2024, and meet the minimum meeting requirements (explained below) to be eligible to show any animal species at 2024 fair.
- Each Clover Bud & 4-H Member must attend at least 5 species meetings per year (between September 2023-July 2024) to meet minimum meeting requirements, to be eligible to show/exhibit animals of any species, at the 2024 Niagara County Fair.
- County level 4-H public presentations can count towards ONE of those 5 meetings, for those showing multiple species, counts for only 1 animal species of 4-Her's choice
- Farm Safety Course (newly offered in 2024) can count towards ONE of those 5 meetings, for only 1 animal species of 4-Her's choice (if showing multiple species).
- Each animal species program/leader has the right to require additional requirements in order to be eligible to show that species within their program, at leader's discretion.

#### **Mandatory Poultry Pullorum Testing**

Save the date!

Date: Tuesday, June 25 Time: 3:00 -6:00pm

Place: Fairgrounds, back of poultry barn

Testing is MANDATORY in order for ALL birds to come to fair. If your bird is not tested and does not have a band on it's leg, it will not be allowed at fair.

Rules mandated by NYS Vets:

- Poultry (with the exception of doves, pigeons, and waterfowl) must be accompanied by 1.results of a negative pullorum typhoid test conducted within 90 days prior to exhibition OR 2. proof that the birds originated directly from a US pullorum-typhoid clean flock or equivalent flock.
- Poultry qualified by 90-day test must be identified by official leg band.
- Proof of NPIP status must be in the form of an NPIP certificate or purchase receipt containing NPIP certification information. If utilizing a receipt, it must be dated within 1 year of the date of admission to

If you have purchased birds within the last year (2023) provide Kate Handrich with copies of your receipts, this could save you from needing to be Pullorum tested at our clinic in June!


The annual Animal Crackers program provides New York youth with fun, hands-on, science-oriented learning experiences on Animal Science topics. This workshop is for 4-H members interested in learning more about their favorite livestock, companion or pet animal species; emphasis on different species groupings and activities varies annually. Participants will learn about different aspects of animal care, interact and exchange information with faculty, staff, students, professional producers, industry experts, and more, utilizing the unique facilities of Cornell University. Hands-on workshops are planned for each species group.

Each year an opening presentation kicks off the event with a welcoming statement or remarks related to the annual theme. Livestock production and companion animal themes are offered every year, Dairy topics in odd years, and Horse topics in even years. A noon-time demonstration and closing program is also typically featured.

Workshop presenters and topics are selected by a planning committee that looks at trends and current issues. Youth input on topics is also solicited through statewide advisory committees and educator feedback.
