CCE - Monroe County Agriculture Program Update July 2025

Program Highlights

Direct Education Workshops & Outreach:

- Growing Peppers and Tomatoes Together Virtual Workshop, 6/26 served two main goals. The first was to teach community members about growing peppers and tomatoes in their backyards, and the second was to connect them to local farmers. This workshop, a collaboration with Kirby Farms, was presented by a young couple, Chad and Mandy Kirby. Additionally, the CCE nutritionist shared the benefits of eating fresh produce. 43 participants joined the session.
- Farm Tour for Monroe County Legislators, 8/13 Monroe County CCE's Ag Program Educator and S&WCD director are detailing the tour's agenda. They visited all three hosting farms and discussed the agenda with the farmers. We have 26 people registered, including Pam Helming, NYS Senate Member. One more invite will be sent to encourage BOD members and legislators, along with their spouses, to join. The objective of the tour is to highlight new and existing products, practices, technologies & equipment that shape the farming industry today.

<u>Direct/Indirect Farmer Support through Grant-Based Projects</u>

- Agritourism Workshop Monthly Lunch Series, 6/10: this month's session, Agritourism for Horse Farms, focuses on hosting the public at the equestrian facilities. Led by Harvest NY and presented by an Agritourism PWT member.
- New York Outcomes Fund (NYOF) The enrolled farmers received their second payment for the 2024
 enrollment year. The payment serves as a financial incentive and provides farmers with the ability to
 implement regenerative practices on their farms. Several farmers wanted to increase their enrolled
 acreage, but unfortunately, there isn't currently enough funding to accommodate them.
- Agricultural Farmland Protection Plan Update final version of the plan has been submitted to the
 Committee for final comments. The MC Economic and Planning Department and Labella contractors will
 schedule two public hearings for the public, including the farming community.
- Farmland Protection Board The Board met in May to discuss the construction of ~30K feet of water main, valves, hydrants, and appurtenances along Curtis Road, Moul Road, and Bennett Road in the Town of Parma within the Agricultural District.

<u>Friday Fresh</u>: is a bi-monthly or monthly eblast providing farmers and other agricultural operators with the latest information regarding e.g. grants, regulations, events, workshops, etc. There were two editions in July already. The farmers' feedback on this communication has been positive, they appreciate the updates.
