A project area is defined as a unit of work for example, completing a wooden bench. You must learn the materials that are needed, how to build a strong structure, learning how to use different tools and other various research that may go into the project. This is the basis of “learn by doing”. Each project consists of a series of learning experiences to help shape the character of 4-H youth and teach lifelong skills. To be considered a project it must be a long-term learning experience (at least 6 hours in length). The Awards Committee will make a final determination upon review of the submitted portfolio and award application. A member can apply for more than one Project Mastery Award. Members ages 8 to 19 (juniors and seniors) can apply for these awards.

A County Medal award cannot be received more than once in the same project area. However, a 4-H'er can receive County Medals in multiple project areas in the same year. Members ages 12 to 18 (juniors and seniors) can be nominated for this award. The Awards Committee will make a final determination upon review of the submitted portfolio, award applications and nominations.
