It is a place where you record all of the projects you completed, exhibits you entered, awards you received and community service you participated in. The 4-H Project Summary will be a valuable document as you become eligible for different 4-H awards. You will also find it valuable to you when you apply for scholarships, college or a job where you need to list some of your accomplishments.

The 4-H Project Summary is something EVERY 4-H member should complete themselves. Your 4-H leader or parent will help you, but the job of filling it out and keeping it up to date belongs to you, as the 4-H member. It is also VERY helpful to keep track of your accomplishments and projects over the past year by filing out the “4-H Portfolio Summary Worksheet”. We recommend filling it out as you go along throughout the 4-H year.

When your project summary is complete, it should be accompanied by any award applications you wish to pursue. The 4-H Project Summary’s will be reviewed by 4-H volunteers and staff.

Your completed 4-H Project Summary should be placed in your cumulative 4-H Portfolio. This allows the 4-H volunteer or staff to view all your accomplishments over the years. It is also very important if you are applying for any further awards that your current 4-H Project Summary is accompanied by the past years summaries to show the length of involvement in a program area.

Medal:

The following items need to be achieved/completed (see awards informational packet) in order to receive a Teen Leadership Medal.

- ☐ Be at least age 13
- ☐ Demonstrated the accomplishment in overall 4-H leadership and growth in portfolio

The following items need to be achieved/completed (see awards informational packet) in order to receive a 4-H Community Service Achievement Award.

- ☐ Submission of an updated portfolio for the current 4-H year.
- ☐ Members ages 8-18 are eligible for this award.
- ☐ Completed at least 25 hours of community service/4-H promotion
- ☐ Demonstrated commitment to service and assisting others/offering to help without being asked, etc.
