<u>Project and Activity Record Books</u> <u>Due September 29th- Available Online!</u>


Another county fair is in the books! A great way to chronicle the 2024-2025 year is to complete a Project Record book. For 4-H'ers, ages 8-18, the record book is a light green booklet; for Cloverbuds, it is a white booklet. Both can be picked up in the 4-H Office or now found online. All 4-H'ers and Cloverbuds who turn in a completed record book will receive a certificate at Achievement Night. Also, turning in a Project Record book is one of the requirements to be eligible for the county medals/rosettes awarded on Achievement Night. Each year 40 or more businesses and corporations make available county medals of honor in over 30 program areas which may be awarded to 4-H members, ages 12 and over, who have shown excellence in their project areas.


