Vegetable Garden Planting: May 30

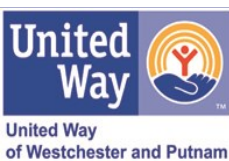
Patterson Library: 12:30-2:30pm

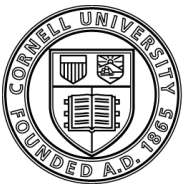

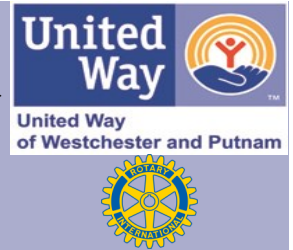
