Program Highlights

- The 2025 NYS 4-H Japanese International Exchange Program, supported by Jessica Reid has wrapped up. Twenty-eight youth and two chaperones spent twenty-eight days with host families around New York State and the United States.
- The Cultivating Community summer program, a youth development initiative that operates in
