

Seneca County Recycling Guide

The items listed below may be placed in the same blue bin or toter

A per stop maximum of **eight (8)** 17 gallon recycling <u>bins</u> **OR two (2)** 65 gallon <u>toters</u> (clearly labeled for recycling) is permitted.

Preparation: Clean to remove food residue and odors. Remove and discard lids and tops.

<u>Do not</u> place items in large garbage bags.

Glass	Clear or color food or beverage bottles and jars. No broken glass.
Newspapers and Magazines	Any newspaper, inserts, magazine and catalogs. Fold neatly and
	place in brown paper bag or place loose in blue box or toter.
Metal/Aluminum Cans and Foil	Any metal food can or aluminum foil.
Plastic	Containers with recycling code #1 - #7 on the bottom with three
	recycling arrows. Styrofoam cannot be included. No motor oil
	containers.
Corrugated Cardboard	Cardboard with wavy middle layer ONLY. Flatten all boxes.
	Remove excess tape and labeling. Cut to maximum of 3 ft. x 3 ft.
	by 18 inches high. Tie in bundles.
Boxboard	Examples include cereal and tissue boxes, paper towel rolls and
	soda carriers. Flatten and place in blue bin or toter.
Office Paper and Junk Mail	Advertising flyers, colored or white paper, envelopes, shredded
	paper, and computer paper. Place in brown bag or loose in the
	blue bin or toter.

Items that are NOT recyclable: Gable-top containers, Styrofoam (even with a # and recycling symbol), window or broken glass, light bulbs, aerosol cans, scrap metal, ceramics, china, Pyrex, any hazardous material and/or containers, such as motor oil containers. *Plastic bags can only be returned to supermarkets and other stores that accept them.* See back for full list of bags and wraps that recycle this way.

Helpful Reminders

- Recycling pick-up starts at 6:30am through 5:00pm on your scheduled day. Pick-ups throughout the day are based upon route efficiencies. To ensure pick-ups, please have your containers out by 6:30am.
- No pick-up on the following days: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.
 If your normal collection day falls on or after one of the observed Holidays then your collection for that week will be delayed one service day. All collections are completed by the end of business on Saturday.

Blue Bins are available on the 1st floor at the Seneca County Office Building located at: 1 DiPronio Drive, Waterloo, NY 13165.

Toters are available to Seneca County residents for purchase. A 65 gallon toter from **Cardinal Disposal** can be used in lieu of 4 blue bins.

Electronics Recycling at Seneca Meadows Landfill

Weekend Drop-off hours are Saturdays 6:00am - 10:00am & Sundays 8:00am - 10:00am

- Electronics recycling is free for Seneca County Residents
- A maximum of 3 televisions OR computer monitors containing cathode ray tubes may be recycled per household, per weekend. Other electronics do not have quantity limitations
 - Proof of residency is required

THE FOLLOWING PLASTIC BAGS AND WRAPS CAN BE RECYCLED WITH YOUR GROCERY BAGS AT YOUR GROCERY STORE!

Please recycle only clean, dry plastic bags and film. Remove receipts or any other items from bags.

NO Degradable/compostable film or bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, or frozen food bags.
