PACIFIC COWBOY MEMORIAL AWARD

The "Pacific Cowboy" Memorial Award is presented to the horse/rider combination with the most points over the most divisions in a single show season. "Cowboy" was a paint gelding who began his show career in Steuben County 4-H and competed for the next 12 show season with his girls. Together, he and his riders earned nearly 500 breed association points in everything from halter to dressage, western pleasure to over fences. "Cowboy" passed away very unexpectedly at 19 years old, only a few days before his first show of the season.

The VonHagn family sponsors this award not only to honor Cowboy's memory, but to honor the accomplishment of another 4-Her who has worked tirelessly to train, care for, and compete with their horse; who in the process, have developed a wonderful partnership with one another. REGIONAL DAIRY BOWL

Dairy Quiz Bowl contests allow youth to showcase their knowledge of the dairy industry, ruminant nutrition, calf health, food safety, crops, and other relevant fields in a Jeopardy style team competition. These contests are offered at both the regional and state levels, at Beginner (8-10 years old), junior (9-14 years old), and senior (14-19 years old).

REGIONAL & STATE HIPPOLOGY

The Hippology Contests offer 4-H youth enrolled in the 4-H Horse Program the opportunity to demonstrate the breadth of their knowledge and reasoning ability in subject matter related to equine science and management in a competitive setting. Members may compete as an individual or part of a team. The contest involves identification, interactive stations, horse judging, written examinations and problem-solving.

REGIONAL & STATE HORSE BOWL

Quiz Bowl offers 4-H members the opportunity to demonstrate their horse knowledge in a competitive setting. The Regional Contest has divisions for Novice, Junior, and Senior. Members compete as teams. Each team competes in several "Jeopardy-like" contests. Questions are presented by a moderator and answers are given by hitting a buzzer to indicate that you have the answer. Points are gained and lost based on the speed with which you come up with the answer and the accuracy of your responses.

REGIONAL & STATE HORSE COMMUNICATIONS

Horse Communications offers 4-H members the opportunity to demonstrate their horse knowledge and public speaking skills. Members can choose any topic to speak on, as long as it relates to the equine industry.
