Through mobile markets and nutrition education, we empower individuals and families to make healthy choices, strengthen local food systems, and build a more resilient and nourished community.



Thanks to the generous financial support of the Steuben County Office for the Aging (OFA), the Veggie Van season was able to be extended four additional weeks, for a total of 16 weeks. Their contribution also helped provide produce vouchers for participants in the Veggie Van Nutrition Education Series, ensuring that those learning about healthy eating could immediately put that knowledge into practice by purchasing fresh fruits and vegetables at the Veggie Van.

During the 6-week SNAP-Ed Nutrition Education classes, participants learned about healthy eating, budgeting, and cooking skills, earning \$20 Veggie Van vouchers each week to buy fresh produce. **32**


