Bringing Native Plants into Your Garden



Our own gardens are wildlife preserves that represent the last chance we have for sustaining plants and animals that were once common throughout the U.S. Learn why it is important to

use native plants in your landscapes to support birds and insects and learn strategies for creating a diverse and beautiful home landscape.

Creating a Welcoming Garden for Hummingbirds and Butterflies

How do you attract butterflies and hummingbirds to your garden? This presentation will guide you through the plant selection process as well



as provide tips on what to do and what not to do to have success. Learn about the lifecycles of butterflies and hummingbirds as well as what to look for in their behaviors and physical features.

Harvesting, Saving and Planting Seeds

Learn how to identify, harvest, and propagate native plants from seeds that are found in your own backyard. Learn how to properly harvest seeds and the best ways to save them over



the winter, plant them in fall, or start them in spring. Winter sowing will also be discussed.

Native Perennials & Groundcovers



Learn about easy to grow Native Perennials that can be added to your landscape to support pollinators and the environment. These plants will reduce your need to water, are lower

maintenance, and will eliminate the need for pesticides and herbicides. Learn about Groundcovers which will reduce the need to weed, mulch, or mow.

Flower Gardening

Dahlias



This class covers planting Dahlia tubers for optimal blooms, caring for these magnificent plants, and the best methods for cutting Dahlias for arrangements. Learn how to overwinter your

tubers for successful crops for years to come.

Lower Maintenance Perennial Gardening

While we love the look of a lush, flower-filled garden, the classic border with three seasons of continuous bloom, such a garden requires a lot of work. But we don't want a concrete slab either.



We want something in between these extremes, something that meets our needs as our lives get busier and our bodies get older. This presentation covers the basics of lower-maintenance gardening, including designing a lower-maintenance garden, simplifying and editing existing plantings, and suggestions of plants that require less maintenance.

Perennial Garden Basics



Perennials are a wonderful way to have a garden that doesn't need to be replanted every year. In this presentation, you will learn how to select perennials

that are right for your garden conditions, how to plant them, care for them during the summer months, divide them when needed and how to put them to bed in the fall. Bloom times will be addressed as well as native perennials that will attract butterflies. We'll take a look at species that thrive in the northeast in both sun and shade conditions.

Awakening the Garden in Spring

This presentation covers essential steps for getting your garden off to a good start in the Spring including planning your garden, starting seeds at home, spring clean-up,



amending your soil, reducing and diversifying your lawn, choosing and siting seeds and plants, and more.

Designing Your Garden: Tools and Tips

This talk is geared toward the home gardener contemplating a new or re-designed garden. The talk covers fundamental principles of garden design as well as key concepts for planting once a



design is established. It includes tips and tools for the long haul as well. With this information in hand, it is possible for every gardener to have a well-designed garden.

Gardening Basics 101



This basic gardening presentation is intended for beginners or for those who have encountered difficulties in their garden. Site selection, garden preferences, sunlight, terminology, soil, fertilizers, hardiness zones, and

reading seed packets are among the topics introduced. Both flower and vegetable gardening will be addressed. Gardeners should know that with some knowledge, success is possible, and gardening should be enjoyed!

Getting to Know Your Weeds

Discover what is considered a weed and how to identify based on classification (Annual, Biennial, Perennial, Invasive Species). We will discuss weed management strategies and the mistakes that

Healthy Habits for Gardening

Putting Your Garden to Bed

This presentation covers many of the tasks you should tackle to prepare your garden for winter and anticipate its re-



awakening in spring: amending your soil, planting bulbs, preparing your vegetable and perennial gardens for winter, protecting shrubs and trees, lawns, deer proofing, propagating by seed and division, caring for tools, and more.
