The NWNY Dairy, Livestock and Field Crops Team is one of the outstanding regional agricultural Cornell Cooperative Extension programs in New York, serving a multi-county region in the western part of the state. The team's specialists work together with Cornell faculty and extension educators statewide to provide service to farms large and small; whether dairy, livestock, hay, corn, wheat or soybean focused. The team is part of the Cornell College of Agriculture & Life Sciences' Pro-Dairy program outreach.

Educational programs and individual assistance cover a wide area of best management practices as well as dairy farm business. A bilingual dairy specialist provides dairy farm producers with employee training and human resource facilitation in Spanish. Educational and support venues range from individual farm management team meetings and troubleshooting to multi-day classroom and hands-on trainings. Plus we offer farmer group discussion meetings and day long symposiums.


