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CCE Monroe County 4-H Program Update January 2026

Program Highlights

- In December Cultivating Community members put together 80 winter break activity kits for the families of St. Mark's & St. John's Episcopal Church, including a custom-made activity booklet with hand-drawn coloring pages. The Cultivators also helped distribute food to 76 families at the People's Pantry.
- Students in Kali Maher's class at Indian Landing Elementary (Penfield) earned third place in the New York Agriculture in the Classroom Mac & Cheese Challenge with their recipe, "*Mrs. Maher's Cheesy Delight*," applying skills learned through 4-H Agriculture in the Classroom lessons.
- 4-H educators continue to have a strong presence in classrooms across the county, bringing Dairy in the Classroom and lessons connecting youth to cultures from around the world to more than 1,500 students each month.
