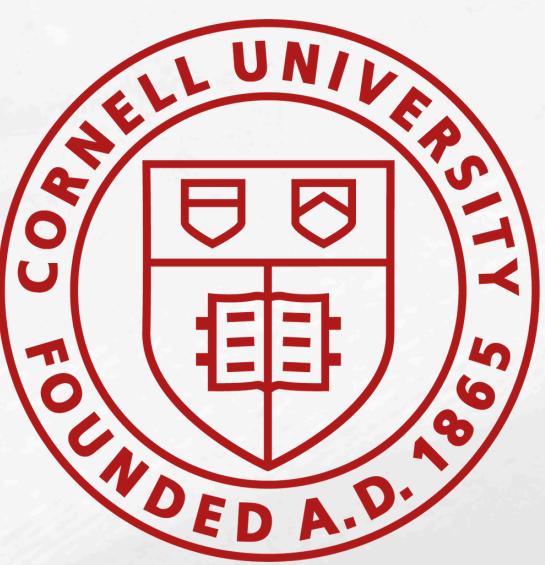

Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP)

EFNEP helps families, individuals, and youth build healthy habits that last a lifetime. Through free, hands-on workshops in cooking, nutrition, and wellness, participants learn practical ways to eat smart, move more, and live well.

Programs include nutrition and wellness education for youth, families, and child care providers (eligible for training credit), as well as gardening and food preservation workshops that promote healthy, sustainable living.

Together, these efforts empower Delaware County residents to make informed choices that support healthier lives and stronger communities.

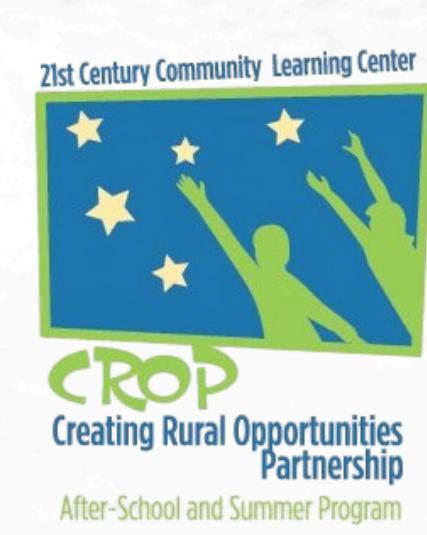
Rural Health Alliance
