Volunteers serve essential roles in the community landscape. Their service helps to meet needs that would be unattainable without them. Independent Sector estimates the economic value of a volunteer hour to be \$34.79. This figure is calculated using a national formula that estimates the cost of replacing that volunteer labor with paid staff. Volunteers contribute time and labor to organizations while helping to shape the missions, values, and quality of services provided. This guide is designed to help adults of any age or ability learn about the many opportunities to be of service in Chemung County. Information does change quickly, so we will be updating this guide continuously as we receive new information. Youth looking for service opportunities can connect with their schools and youth service organizations as well as the organizations listed in this guide.

Selecting the Opportunity that is Right for YOU!

Volunteer service can be a fulfilling experience that enriches your life when you find the role that is right for you. Here are a few questions to ask yourself as you consider the many opportunities available.

1. Is there a specific organization or cause that you are passionate about? This might be an effort that you or someone you know has or could have benefitted from or something that is close to your heart.
2. What skills or talents would you like to share with others? What would you like to spend time doing?
3. What do you have availability for at this time? Are you looking for something you would commit to on a regular basis or more occasional opportunities?
4. How far and how often can you commute to volunteer? What transportation options are available to you?

Volunteer positions often involve application processes and training before engaging in the work. Make a list of questions to ask the volunteer coordinator before agreeing to a position. It's OK to say no to an opportunity that is not right for you or to change roles as your interests change. Many volunteers serve in multiple roles over the course of their service.
