Cornell Cooperative Extension and Soil and Water Conservation have again teamed up to offer a wonderful selection of trees and shrubs. The Seedling Sale has a long-standing tradition of offering trees and shrubs that create habitat and protect water quality. Trees reduce the amount of storm-water runoff, which reduces erosion and water pollution while stabilizing shorelines, reducing the effects of flooding. And our selection of plants includes native trees, shrubs and perennials that support birds and pollinators.

Why native plants?

Plants native to our area provide food and shelter for nesting birds and nectar and pollen for specialist pollinators like many of our native bees. Our backyards, gardens, and parks can provide vital habitat for pollinators and birds, especially if we choose native plants well suited to our growing conditions.

We also have a selection of cost-effective native plant plugs. These small perennial starts are a thrifty way to get a head start on creating your backyard habitat. From shade to sun, we have you covered. Be sure to shop before the deadline of March 27. Plants will be sold online only, on a first-come, first-served basis, and there are limited quantities of seedlings.

Start your fruitful landscape.

You'll find thornless blackberries and Red Lake currants as well as native shrubs that produce fruit. Shiro plums and Georgia peaches, selected for disease resistance, are a great start to your home orchard.

Wildlife boxes, too!

Wildlife boxes can help foster a diverse avian community and maintain a healthy ecosystem. They provide a secure space for birds to raise their young and shelter from bad weather. Boxes have been used successfully where surveys have shown that virtually no natural nest sites occur.


DECIDUOUS SEEDLINGS	Care and preferences	Price & Bundle size
New Jersey Tea <i>Ceanothus americanus</i>	Shrub. 2'-4' tall and wide. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers dry to medium, well-drained sandy or rocky soils. Drought tolerant. Dense clusters of white flowers bloom in early- to mid-summer. Attracts pollinators.	\$26 10-pack, 1-0
Ninebark <i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>	Shrub. 5'-10' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Tolerates a wide range of soils. Prefers average, well-drained soil. Clusters of small white to pink-tinged flowers in late-spring attract pollinators. Provides cover for birds.	\$22 10-pack 12"-18"
Allegheny Serviceberry <i>Amelanchier laevis</i>	Tree, small. 15' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Tolerates a wide range of soils. White blossoms in early-spring before most other trees. Purple berries in appear in June. Berries are suitable for fresh eating or jams. Attracts early pollinators. Berries are prized by birds.	\$29 10-pack 12"-18"
Nannyberry <i>Viburnum lentago</i>	Shrub or small tree. 5'-20' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Flower clusters in late-spring followed by blue-black berries. Provides food and cover for wildlife and supports pollinators.	\$14 10-pack 18"-24"
Dwarf Bush Honeysuckle <i>Diervilla lonicera</i>	Shrub. Typically 2'-4' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Tolerates dry, rocky or average garden soils. Tubular yellow flowers bloom early to mid-summer. Provides nectar and cover for pollinators and other wildlife.	\$20 10-pack 12"-18", 1-0
Eastern Redbud <i>Cercis canadensis</i>	Small tree. 15'-25' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Adaptable to a wide range of soil conditions. Moderately drought tolerant. In early to mid-spring, pink to purple pea-like blossoms provide early nectar for bees.	\$18 10-pack 18"-24", 2-0
American Hazelnut <i>Corylus americana</i>	Shrub or small tree. 9'-12' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Adaptable to moist to dry soils. Yellow catkins in very early-spring provide pollen for bees. Edible hazelnuts ripen in late-summer.	\$22 10-pack 12"-18"
Buttonbush <i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>	Shrub. 6'-10' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Tolerates dry to wet soils. Clusters of white, fragrant flowers bloom in late spring to mid-summer. Attractive to pollinators. Nutlet fruits in late summer feed wildlife.	\$25 10-pack 12"-18", 2-0
Swamp Rose Mallow <i>Hibiscus moschuetos</i>	Perennial. 4'-7' tall. Full Sun. Moist to wet soils. Tolerates seasonal flooding. Blooms mid- to late-summer with large flowers. Attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Deer browse may occur on young shoots.	\$26 10-pack Crowns
Sugar Maple <i>Acer saccharum</i>	Tree, small. 12'-35' tall. Semi-evergreen. Part Shade, Part Sun. Acidic soil, high in organic matter. Medium wet to boggy soil. Fragrant foliage. White flowers. Pollinator friendly. Protect from deer during establishment.	\$6 5-pack 18"-24", 2-0
Bald Cypress <i>Taxodium distichum</i>	Tree. Conifer. 50'-70' tall. Full Sun. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soils and tolerates standing water. Feathery foliage emerges soft green, turning rich russet-orange to cinnamon brown in fall before dropping for winter.	\$34 10-pack 18"-24", 1-0
Catberry <i>Ilex mucronata</i>	Shrub. 5'-10' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers moist to wet, acidic soil. Not tolerant of drought. Flowers in late spring on separate male and female plants—both sexes are needed for fruit set. Bright red berry-like drupes ripen mid- to late-summer and may persist into fall, contrasting with yellow fall foliage and providing important food for migrating songbirds.	\$16 10-pack 6"-18", 1-0
Spicebush <i>Lindera benzoin</i>	Shrub. 6'-12' tall. Full Shade to Part Shade. Prefers moist, rich, acidic soils. Clusters of pale-yellow flowers open in very early-spring before the leaves, providing an important nectar source for early pollinators.	\$19 10-pack 12"-18", 1-0
Witch Hazel <i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>	Shrub. 10'-20' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers moist soil. Clusters of yellow flowers in very late-fall to winter. Seeds for birds and small mammals. The source of witch hazel oil. Attracts pollinators. Deer tolerant.	\$24 10-pack 12"-18", 2-0

FRUIT	Care and preferences	Price & Bundle size
'Honeyoye' Strawberry <i>Fragaria 'Honeyoye'</i>	Perennial. Full Sun. Prefers medium to light, well-drained soil. June-bearing. This edible fruit is bred for winter hardiness. With good first-year care, it should bloom 1 year after planting.	\$49 10-pack Crowns
'Red Lake' Currant <i>Ribes rubrum 'Red Lake'</i>	Shrub. 3'-5' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers moist, well-drained, fertile soil rich in organic matter. Long, hanging clusters of berries ripen in mid-summer. Good for fresh eating, jams and baking.	\$40 5-pack
Elderberry <i>Sambucus canadensis</i>	Shrub. 6'-14' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers damp areas. Summer clusters of white, fragrant flowers support pollinators. Dark purple to black berries in late-summer can be cooked for jams, syrups and wines.	\$24 10-pack 12-18"
Common Persimmon <i>Diospyros virginiana</i>	Tree. 30'-60' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers well-drained, loamy or sandy sites. Drought tolerant. Flowers in spring. Fruit ripens in fall. Good for fresh eating, baking and preserves. Attracts pollinators and wildlife.	\$19 10-pack 18"-24", 1-0
Gloria Peach <i>Prunus persica 'Gloria'</i>	Tree. Medium-sized. Full Sun. Winter hardy. Fruit is very large. Ripens into late summer. Good for fresh-eating, canning, freezing and baking. Tree is resistant to bacterial spot and bears reliably with heavy crops when properly thinned.	\$45 Qty 1 1/2"-5/8"
Hull Thornless Blackberry <i>Rubus fruticosus 'Hull Thornless'</i>	Shrub. Full Sun. Prefers well-drained, moderately fertile soil with consistent moisture. Support with trellis or wires. Berries are deep black and excellent for fresh eating, freezing and baking. Fruit is produced on second-year canes.	\$45 5-pack
Shiro Plum <i>Prunus salicina 'Shiro'</i>	Tree. 12'-20' tall. Full Sun. Zones 5-9. Prefers well-drained, loamy soil. Needs compatible Japanese plum for cross-pollination. Cluster of white blossoms in spring followed by clusters of plums. Good for fresh eating, canning and cooking.	\$40 Qty 1 1/2"-5/8"

Perennial Plugs

TREES & SHRUBS ARE BARE ROOT and must be planted the weekend of receipt. Keep in a cool, dark place, with a damp root-covering such as newspaper. Always water-in as you plant, regardless of forecast. Bareroot planting reduces the chance of transporting invasive organisms and lowers prices, a savings we are able to pass on to you.

A **SEEDLING** is a tree which was grown in the planting bed in which it was sown for one (1-0), two (2-0) or three (3-0) years.

A **TRANSPLANT** is a seedling that was moved from the planting bed to another bed and planted with greater space between the rows. For example, a (2-2) transplant has been in the seedling bed for two years and a transplant bed for two years.


A **P+1** refers to a seedling grown as a potted plug, root pruned, then grown in the field for one (1-0) year to grow more robust.

R-C= Rooted cutting.

A **PLUG** is a small cell in a tray that allows deep root growth.

PERENNIALS	Care and preferences	Price & Bundle size
Blue Ice' Amsonia <i>Amsonia tabernaemontana</i> 'Blue Ice'	15"-18" tall. Full Sun to Part Sun. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Star-shaped, blue flowers appear in late-spring to early-summer. Pollinator friendly.	\$18 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
'Blue Moon' Woodland Phlox <i>Phlox divaricata</i> 'Blue Moon'	Groundcover. Part Shade. Creeping woodland perennial. Clouds of blousy blue flowers held on 6"-7" stems in spring. Tidy low foliage remains through the growing season at 3" high. Protect from deer and rabbits.	\$32 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
'Husker Red' Foxglove Beardtongue <i>Penstemon digitalis</i> 'Husker Red'	2'-3' tall. Full Sun to Part Shade. Prefers medium, well-drained soils and tolerates clay. White, snapdragon-like flowers in early- to mid-summer are held on tall spikes and attract pollinators. Deer tolerant.	\$32 10 plugs ea. 2"x5"
Anise Hyssop <i>Agastache foeniculum</i>	2'-4' tall. Full Sun to Part Sun. Prefers well-drained soils. Drought tolerant. Mid-summer into fall, spikes of purple flowers attract pollinators. Anise-scented leaves can be used in teas and recipes.	\$30 10 plugs ea. 2"x5"
Blazing Star <i>Liatris spicata</i>	2'-4' tall. Full Sun. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Spikes of purple flower heads open from mid- to late-summer. Pollinator and bird friendly. Deer tolerant.	\$22 10-pack, corms
'Dales Strain' Coral Bells <i>Heuchera americana</i> 'Dales Strain'	8"-12" tall. Part Shade to Shade. Prefers moist, humus-rich soil. Small white to pink bells appear late-spring to early-summer. Attracts pollinators.	\$39 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
Spotted Beebalm <i>Monarda punctata</i>	1'-3' tall. Full Sun. Prefers dry to medium, well-drained sandy or rocky soils. Thrives in heat once established. Pale-yellow to cream flowers spotted with purple in mid- to late-summer. Attracts pollinators.	\$30 10 plugs ea. 2"x5"
Pink Profusion Bowman's Root <i>Porteranthus trifoliata</i> 'Pink Profusion'	2'-3' tall. Part Sun to Part Shade. Prefers moist, humus-rich, well-drained soils. Masses of pink starry flowers in late-spring to early-summer. Attracts pollinators.	\$50 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
Virginia Bluebells <i>Mertensia virginica</i>	12"-18" tall. Part Shade to Shade. Prefers moist, humus-rich, well-drained soils. Clusters of tubular flowers open pink and age to a sky blue in early to mid-spring. Important nectar source for early pollinators.	\$52 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
Butterfly Weed <i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>	18"-30" tall. Full Sun. Prefers dry to medium, well-drained soils. Vivid orange flower clusters in early to mid-summer, and decorative pods. Supports monarch caterpillars and many pollinators.	\$34 10 plugs ea. 2"x5"
Wild Cranesbill <i>Geranium maculatum</i>	12"-18" tall. Part Shade to Shade. Prefers moist, humus-rich, well-drained soils. Flowers in shades of light pink to lavender bloom in mid-spring to early-summer. Attracts pollinators.	\$44 8 plugs ea. 2.2"x4"
'Summer Sunshine' Coreopsis <i>Coreopsis palustris</i> 'Summer Sunshine'	30"-36" tall. Full Sun. Thrives in moist to wet soils. Glossy foliage and masses of golden-yellow daisies in late-summer to fall. Attracts pollinators.	\$30 10 plugs ea. 2"x5"

Black Hills Spruce <i>Picea glauca</i> var. <i>densata</i>	Tree. 30'-60' tall. Conifer. Full Sun. Prefers moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soils. Makes excellent screen or windbreak. Valuable nesting and habitat for birds and other wildlife. Deer tolerant.	\$49 10-pack 16"-22" 2-2
White Fir <i>Abies concolor</i>	Tree. 40'-70' tall. Conifer. Native to Western U.S. Full Sun. Prefers rich, well-drained soils. Drought- and heat-tolerant. Excellent screening. Keeps lower branches well. Deer tolerant.	\$44 10-pack 8-15" 2-2 TP
White Spruce <i>Picea glauca</i>	Tree. 20'-40' tall. Conifer. Full Sun to Part Sun. Requires medium moisture. Prefers cool, moist, well-drained soils. Intolerant of salt spray. Branches offer nesting sites. Seeds eaten by small mammals and songbirds. Deer tolerant.	\$39 10-pack 15"-24" 2 ^{1/2} -2
