Annuals - 3" Pots



Coleus - Vegetative, TerraScape All That Lava **\$5.00**

A vibrant, top-performing series of free-branching, upright Coleus with bold, colorful foliage. Perfect for containers or landscape use, these varieties offer striking color and texture with minimal distraction from blooms. Deep red, feathered leaves that intensify with age. Height 16". Spread 16".



Ptilotus, Joey **\$5.00**

A native of central Australia, Joey is extremely heat and drought tolerant with its leathery foliage. Striking "bottle-brush" plumes are silvery-pink with darker tips. Pairs beautifully with pinks or purples in mixed containers. Height 14". Spread 12-14".



Dahlia, Karma Caroline **\$5.00**

Gorgeous, vibrant blooms on strong, sturdy stems make them a perfect choice for cut flowers. This series offers a mix of flower types on upright habits that will bloom late spring - summer. Height 36-48". Width 18-24".



Annuals 4-Pack



Lobelia - Premium, Masterpiece Blue with Eye \$5.00

Fleuroselect Award Winner. This first Lobelia hybrid from seed matches the performance of vegetative varieties. It has large blue flowers with a white center on a branching, mounding plant. Suitable for pot and container production and landscape applications. Heat tolerant. Height 12". Width 16".



Petunia-Premium, Evening Scentsations Blue \$5.00

The first petunia to receive an AAS award for its lovely fragrance and stunning color. Considered one of the best blue petunias, it has a nice mounding and spreading habit. Fragrance is stronger in the evening. Good weather tolerance and rain resistance. Height 8-10". Spread 30-35".



Petunia-premium, Opera Supreme Raspberry Ice \$5.00

Spectacular raspberry-red center that bleeds out on a pale ice-pink flower. Vigorous, trailing petunia spreads up to 3' in sunny locations. 2½" flowers. Excellent garden performance as mass planting, window box, or hanging basket.



Portulaca, Happy Trails Mix \$5.00

Has a low-growing and spreading habit like Sundial, but is the earliest flowering series on the market, up to 2 weeks earlier. Full habit, great for packs, pots, and gardens especially in hot, dry locations. Height 6-9".



Perennials - 6" Pots



Achillea, Summer Berries

\$9.00

Produces beautiful 3-5" flower clusters in shades of orange, red and pink. Blooms early summer to late fall. Upright habit. Height 24". Spread 12-18". Zones 3-10.



Carnation, Grenadin Mix

\$9.00

Mix of all colors. This 20" carnation has 2" flowers on upright plants. Nice clove fragrance. Good for cut flowers. Does well in 1 quart containers. Blooms June and July. Zones 4-10.



Delphinium, Pacific Giant Black Knight

\$9.00

Favorite, old-fashioned variety with elegant flower stalks. Well-suited as a background, especially against a wall or fence. Dark blue with black center. Height 5-6'. June-July blooms. Zones 3-7.



Sedum-upright, Autumn Fire

\$9.00

Showy and versatile, ranging from creeping groundcovers to cut flowers, sedums add interest all season. Drought-tolerant. Blossoms can be left on tall varieties through the winter, adding interest to the landscape and food for birds. Flowers start blue-green, opening to pink, then darkening to red and finally bronze. Height 24-30". Zones 3-9.





Echinacea-purpurea, Sombrero Tres Amigos **\$9.00**

Extremely floriferous, with brilliant colors. Flat flower form, not as deeply reflexed, truly resembles a sombrero. Good winter hardiness, excellent branching. Opens in a peachy-coral. Ages to rose, and fades to burgundy. Height 18-20". Spread 22-24". Zones 4-9. Propagation prohibited.



Echinacea-purpurea, SunSeekers Pumkin Pie **\$9.00**

First-year bloomer. SunSeekers features a unique array of flower colors on a single plant! Produces masses of flowers with vibrant colors that don't fade. Has exceptional vigor and a dense habit. Use in beds, borders, containers or mass plantings. Height 18-24". Spread 18-24". Zones 4-9. Propagation prohibited.



Gaillardia, Arizona Red Shades **\$9.00**

Vigorous plants for average to poor, well-drained or dry soils. A great pollinator plant! Tolerates heat and drought. Short-lived in moist, fertile soil. Intolerant of heavy, wet, winter conditions. Remove faded flowers for continued display. Good for natural plantings, cutting, and drying. Blooms all summer. Height 8-10". Zones 2-10.



Liatris, Floristan Violet **\$9.00**

Excellent cut flowers, fresh or dried. Blooms July-September. Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds all season. Prefers sandy soil and is drought tolerant in summer, but dislikes excessive moisture during winter. Good in 1 qt-2 gal containers.





Phlox-paniculata, Super Ka-Pow White

\$9.00

Showcases vibrant colors on super-sized blooms with excellent branching. Blooms from late spring through summer. Attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds and is rabbit resistant. Low maintenance with strong powdery mildew resistance. Height 18-20". Width 16-18". Zones 4b-9a. Propagation prohibited.



Heuchera (Coral bells), Magma

\$9.00

Spikes of tiny, bell-shaped florets top low, mounded foliage. Prefers rich, well-drained soil. Tolerates stony locations. Use mulch in winter where frost heaving occurs. Good for edging and borders. Deadhead for best results. Blooms May to July. Deer and rabbit resistant. Heights are indicating the leaf structure, not the flower scapes. Propagation prohibited. Its leaves can grow up to 8" across. Has a tidy habit with clusters of pink blossoms on 30" stems, in early summer. Height 14". Spread 24". Zones 4-9.



Rudbeckia hirta Cappuccino

\$9.00

Strong, vigorous with excellent basal branching, Rudbeckia hirta "Cappuccino" is a compact biennial boasting large flowers up to 4in wide, in warm, festive shades of gold, orange, and mahogany. Blooming profusely from early summer to frost, it provides weeks of eye-catching color. The flowers are produced in such quantities that they almost cover the bushy, dark green foliage. An outstanding cut flower, its seed heads have good winter interest unless they are used in dried arrangements. Spread/Height: 18-20in tall and 14-16in wide. Zones: 3-7.



Herbs - 3" Pots



Basil, Pesto Perpetuo

\$5.00

Features green leaves with white edging. Serves as both an ornamental and culinary plant with a robust, lemony flavor. Non-flowering, ensuring abundant harvests. Ideal for pesto. Height 36-48". Width 8-16". Annual.



Lavendar, La Diva Vintage Violet

\$5.00

A first year flowering English lavender with fragrant blue-purple blooms throughout the summer. Compact, upright habit. Attracts bees and butterflies. Height 14-20". Spread 10-12". Zones 4-8.



Mint, Orange

\$5.00

Green, branching stems, tinged with red. White & pink flowers. Very fragrant with bergamot or orange peel scent. Spreads easily in the garden. Height up to 24". Zones 4-11.



Satureja, Indian Mint

\$5.00

Indian Mint is served as tea and its intense mint flavour is used to alleviate headaches. Light green foliage is topped with small, fragrant white flowers from June through August. Trailing habit is suitable for hanging baskets and combinations. Annual.
