

3. Conduct a Rabbit and/or Cavy project.
4. Complete a County Level Public Presentation, participate in a community service activity, and keep an accurate and up to date record book for each area of participation.
5. Record books should be kept up to date throughout the year.
The Record Book must be reviewed by your Rabbit/Cavy Leader or the Rabbit/Cavy Advisory prior to July 15th.


