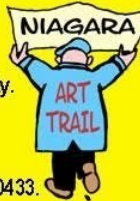

Junior Master Gardeners: Garden Passport ~ Grow Around the World

Sunday, May 17 at 3:30 PM in the Greenhouse **MUST RSVP, NO walk-ins without signing up ahead**

For May, Junior Master Gardeners will be checking on our cool-season crops to see what's ready for harvest, while also planting additional crops in our garden beds. This season, the beds will follow regionally inspired food themes to help youth connect gardening with cultures around the world:

- **Mediterranean Garden (Southern Europe)** – Inspired by countries like Italy and Greece, featuring tomatoes, basil, oregano, parsley, thyme, eggplant, zucchini, and sweet peppers. Flowers like marigolds and nasturtiums will be incorporated for pollinator support and companion planting.
- **Latin American Garden** – A salsa-style garden with tomatoes, hot and sweet peppers, cilantro, onions, tomatillos, and garlic. Sunflowers and zinnias will be added to attract pollinators and bring color to the space.
- **Middle Eastern & North African Garden** – Featuring cucumbers, parsley, dill, mint, radishes, and leafy greens like arugula and spinach. Calendula and borage will be included for beneficial insects and added visual interest.
- **East Asian Garden** – Including bok choy, napa cabbage, scallions, snap peas, radishes, and Asian greens, along with herbs like garlic chives. Edible flowers and companions such as chrysanthemums and nasturtiums will be added where appropriate.

These themed beds will give youth a hands-on way to explore how food, culture, and agriculture connect, while continuing to build their gardening skills throughout the season.

Livestock Auction Rule Reminder

Implemented for Niagara County Fair & Livestock Auction. Each 4-H member will be capped as to how many species they can auction off, based on the following:

- ◆ First year as regular 4-H member- (clover bud years not included) 1 species maximum in auction
- ◆ Juniors - 3 species maximum in auction (but not first year members)**see below**
- ◆ Seniors - 4 species maximum in auction

**First year 4-H member could be considered a beginner or junior, depending on how old they are when they join 4-H for the first time.

Equine Happenings!

Equine Ownership/Lease Form: If you are showing a horse at county fair it must be owned or leased by the exhibitor or a family member by June 1, 2025. Forms are available on the CCE website under the Equine Program or at any county horse show. If you have previously turned in a form for your current horse, you do not need to submit new paperwork.

Equine Showmanship Clinic - Thursday, June 18, 7 PM in the Indoor Arena. You do not need to bring your horse, we will have both large and miniature horses there for you to practice with. This counts as an equine educational meeting to show at fair.

Equine 5-Star test make-up: If you were unable to complete a 5-Star test in March, but would like to take one, no matter what level, please contact me to make arrangements.

Equine Coggins test and Rabies vaccination certificates are required for all horses being exhibited in 4-H classes at the fair. Please have copies of them emailed or handed into Cheryl Bish by July 10 (fair entry deadline). I have to show them to the NYS Veterinarian or you can not show. If your coggins from last year is still good, I kept copies and you only need to send me a rabies certificate. Coggins must be dated 2025 or 2026, Rabies dated between Aug. 1, 2025 and July 10, 2026.
