Fair Passes: Members exhibiting or volunteering with 4-H during Fair be sure to pick up your pass in the 4-H Building at the fairgrounds on judging day Saturday, July 18th between 9:30am-4:00pm.

How to Bring Exhibits to the Fair

Is this your first year participating at the Saratoga County Fair? Here is what is needed to have an exhibit displayed in the 4-H Building at the county fair, step by step.

Step 1: Stop by the 4-H Office at 50 West High Street and pick up these 3 items; a **4-H Exhibitors Handbook**, **entry forms**, and a handful of **exhibit tags**. Advance entry forms are needed for non-static exhibits (including all animals, pet care, group action booths and club exhibits).

Step 2: Read the rules in the Exhibitors Handbook on pages 2-3. Find the department the exhibit fits - for example, Pet Care is Dept. 12. Read the bulleted general rules for the department found directly under the title.

- Select the section and class, follow the rules there as well.
 - For example, Pet Care is Dept. 12 Section A, Class 1

Step 3: Using the Exhibitors Handbook, fill out the **entry form**. List all the items to be exhibited.

Step 4:

- Fill out an **exhibitor's tag** for each exhibit; Name, Town and Club.
- Use the entry form to fill in **Dept., Section, and Class**.
- Under **Exhibit**, write the name or a brief description of the item.
- Add the **Variety** for vegetables and flowers and photographs.

Step 5: Attach the entry tags to the exhibits. Use pins for garments, tape on flat objects such as photos or drawings, or punch a hole in one corner of the entry tag and use string to tie it on.

Step 6: **Saturday, July 18th, 9:30am- 4:00pm is County Fair Exhibit Judging Day.** Bring the exhibits and the paperwork to the 4-H Building at the Saratoga County fairgrounds. At the end of the judging process, turn the entry form in at the table in the center of the building and get a fair pass. Keep your copy of the entry form. The exhibits will be left at the 4-H building and be displayed during the fair, July 21-26. ***Please note - advanced entry forms are turned in directly to the CCE office by July 6th - no exceptions!***

Step 7: After Fair, stop by the 4-H Building Monday, July 27th, 9am - 6pm, and pick up your items. A helpful hint, bring the original entry form with the list of fair items to remember all of your items.

County Fair

Animal Health Considerations



Showing animals at the County Fair presents a risk for disease transmission. Proper precautions taken before, during, and after the fair can help to decrease an animal's exposure to infectious disease, and help to protect your animals at home as well.

Before the fair, make sure that animals have all the required vaccinations, complete any tests required for your particular species, and be sure that you have all of the necessary documentation. Try to minimize stress on the animals and offer the same feeds that you will be taking to the fair. Transport your animals to the fair in clean trailers and avoid the use of commercial trailers.

During the fair, be sure that your animals always have fresh water available and continue the same feeds that were being used at home. Provide plenty of clean bedding as required for each species. As much as possible, do not allow nose to nose contact with animals from other farms, do not share equipment, and use only buckets and tubs from your own farm. For milking animals, it is best to use your own milker claw in common milking parlors. If you bring your own milking unit, do not allow others to use it.

After the fair, isolate show animals from the main herd for 3-4 weeks upon return. Use separate tools and feed equipment while caring for returning animals, and modify the work routine so that they are taken care of last, potentially stopping the spread of contaminants to other animals. Monitor the animals for signs of disease such as fever, diarrhea, skin abnormalities, heel warts, mastitis, or abortions, while minimizing stress as much as possible. If the home herd or flock is up to date on all vaccinations, it will lessen the chance of a disease outbreak due to infection carried home by show animals.


Do not make the mistake of exposing your entire herd or flock to the threat of disease brought home from the County Fair. The fair lasts for six days, but the ramifications of a disease outbreak could last much longer and perhaps cost many dollars to rectify.

Exhibiting Animals for 2026 at the State Fair

To be eligible for the State Fair exhibition, you must receive a blue award with your animal in the class at the County Fair. If you are interested in going on to the State Fair, please contact the 4-H Office for a premium book and entry forms immediately following County Fair.

The completed entry forms must be returned to the 4-H Office on or before **MONDAY**, August 3rd. If you are exhibiting a large animal or a dog, the same animal that was shown at the County Fair must go to State. If you are exhibiting rabbits, cavies, or poultry, substitution of actual animal is allowed, but you must have blue awards to support each entry. Small Animal News

If you are bringing poultry, rabbits or cavies to the County Fair, here are some reminders. **Cage set-up is on Saturday, July 18th at 9:00am. This is mandatory for all exhibitors - No Exceptions!** Do not bring your animals on this day. Your animals can be brought to the fair on Monday, July 20th between 10am and noon or 3pm and 5pm. You must check in with Jillian and have the animal's health checked before caging them. Animals will be exhibited until 8pm on Sunday July 26th. You must help to break down the building before animals are taken home.

No animals are to leave the fairgrounds before 8:00pm on Sunday. Call the 4-H Office at 518-885-8995 if you have any questions.

Volunteers needed: Adults and Junior Superintendents are needed to help supervise the Small Animal Building for shifts during the fair. Call the 4-H Office if you are interested in helping.

Do You Have What It Takes to Be a Junior Superintendent? Looking for Youth and Adults!

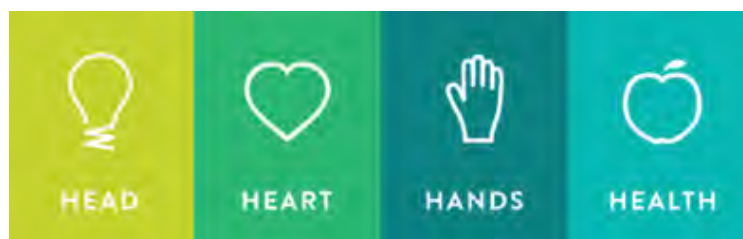

Greg Stevens Named Interim Executive Director of Cornell Cooperative Extension of Saratoga County

Effective July 1, 2026, Greg Stevens has been named Interim Executive Director for Cornell Cooperative Extension of Saratoga County.

Greg brings more than 28 years of experience to the role. He began his career in 4-H Youth Development, where he was hired to provide classroom education through the School Outreach Program while also administering an Academic Enrichment Program during the summer months. During this time, Greg developed and administered the highly successful Reality Check Youth Empowerment Program, and later partnered with school districts to strengthen anti-smoking policies through the Tobacco-Free Schools Program.

In 2015, Greg was promoted to 4-H and Family and Consumer Sciences Issue Leader. In 2023, he was appointed Assistant Director, where he assumed responsibility for the Adirondack Welcome Center Taste NY Program and expanded his work to include collaboration with the agriculture team.

Greg received a Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communications from the State University of New York (SUNY) at Plattsburgh in 1993 and went back to SUNY Plattsburgh for a master's degree in Science in Liberal Studies-Administration and Leadership, graduating in 2011.

“I’m extremely excited about the next chapter for CCE Saratoga,” said Stevens. “We have an incredibly talented staff, and it is an honor to work with such dedicated individuals while providing leadership to this Association on an interim basis—and hopefully continuing in a full-time role in the future. I’ve learned from the best over the years, and I hope to carry forward their outstanding qualities in this new endeavor.”

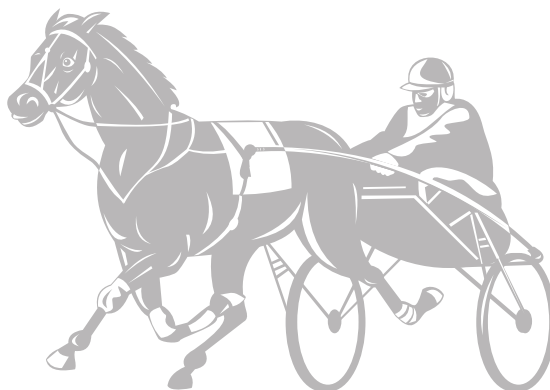

We have the following jobs/tasks that you can volunteer in at fair. With each completed shift you will receive a coupon to the 4-H Snack Bar:

· **Ring Steward (1 person per shift)**

- You accompany the Judge in the ring. They will instruct you to signal the announcer as to how to instruct the class. (we will teach you the hand signals)

· **Arena Crew (1-4 people per shift)**

- This can be 1 person or a team. Your job is to help open and close gates, and help set the arena up for classes that may have patterns, or obstacles. You are boots on the ground, helping make the show happen!

4-H Helmet Rules

- Cleaning the horses stall if the horse is in the stall as well.
- Working a horse on the ground.

Proper footwear should always be worn around horses.

Proper footwear includes hard soled shoes with a heel.

As always, it is the responsibility of each exhibitor to thoroughly clean out the stall(s) before leaving after the show.
