



PACKING FOR DPF 4-H CAMP



WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP:

We recommend that campers pack the following items for a one-week stay at camp:

- Shorts
- T-Shirts
- Underwear
- Socks - at least one pair per day
- Sneakers
- Light Jacket, Rain jacket or poncho
- Sweater or sweatshirt(s) - with a hood preferred
- Bathing suits
- Sweat pants
- Pajamas
- Hat/cap
- Sleeping bag and/or two blankets
- 1 - 2 bed sheets
- Pillow and pillow case
- 1 - 2 towels and washcloths
- Personal Toiletries:
 - Soap (in waterproof container)
 - Shampoo
 - Deodorant
 - Toothbrush/Toothpaste
 - Sunscreen
- Flashlight - with fresh batteries
- Bug spray - pump dispenser **ONLY**

Reminders:

- Please label all of your camper's belongings.
- DPF 4-H Camp is not responsible for any articles of clothing or personal items that are misplaced, lost, or damaged during your camper's stay with us.
- Please do not send valuables.
- If your camper is staying more than one week, we will make arrangements for them to do laundry.

OPTIONAL ITEMS:

Camp users are permitted to bring the following items:

- Baseball mitt
- Tennis racket
- Lacrosse stick
- Basketball and/or soccer ball
- Inexpensive camera
- Guitar, harmonica or other small musical instruments
- Work gloves for farm
- Water shoes

WHAT TO BRING FOR HORSEBACK RIDING CLASSES:

Campers taking Horseback Riding classes must wear long pants and hard-soled shoes with a heel that is no higher than 1" and does not have platform soles (**NO SNEAKERS**). Safety helmets are provided and must be worn by all campers and staff.

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP:

- ✗ Cell Phones or other types of electronic equipment
- ✗ Pressurized aerosol sprays, including but not limited to hair sprays, shaving cream and insect repellents
- ✗ Cigarettes, cigars, matches and lighters
- ✗ Alcohol
- ✗ Candles and lanterns (except battery operated)
- ✗ Sports equipment (except "Optional" items listed above)
- ✗ Weapons of any kind

If a camper brings any of the above items to camp, s/he may be sent home from camp. At a minimum, s/he will be asked to relinquish the items. The camp will not take responsibility for any items confiscated and will only return the items to a parent / guardian.
