Dunaway Well Replacement Project Complete

The ECUA has 28 active water wells distributed throughout its service area. The wells pump water from the Sand-and-Gravel Aquifer, our area's excellent source of potable water. Each year, ECUA delivers more than 13 billion gallons of water to over 90,000 customer connections, a current average of more than 35 million gallons daily.

The ECUA's Dunaway well, originally constructed in 1975, was scheduled for replacement in 2015. The replacement project that began in December 2015 entailed the construction of a new, state-of-the-art water treatment facility and pumping equipment, situated adjacent to the existing well. Once connected to the existing well column, we placed the new well and treatment facility into active service in early 2018, and removed the former treatment facility.

The new Dunaway well is a high-capacity well that is capable of producing 2,000 gallons per minute of potable water, which primarily serves the north-west portion of ECUA's service area, including the expanding Beulah area. Each ECUA well has its own water treatment facility whose purpose is to treat the pumped water, as necessary, to ensure it meets with operating standards and federal and state water quality requirements.

The project cost was \$1.4 million, which included the treatment facility, all the replaced pumping equipment, and all components of the associated site and pipe work required. This new facility will be a significant component of the ECUA's water system, assuring a sufficient and reliable supply of potable water to the growing Beulah area.



Did You Know?



ECUA water is withdrawn from the Sand-and-Gravel Aquifer. Twenty-eight active wells in the ECUA water system and over 1700 plus miles of water mains combine to deliver water to your home. Last year, ECUA pumped and treated an average of 32 million gallons of water daily. This year, the ECUA's daily water production during the month of June was approximately 35.7 million gallons per day (mgd). ECUA has more than sufficient pumping and water distribution capability to accommodate this demand, but we need your help.

In order to moderate some of the extreme peaks in usage, and to maintain balanced system pressures, **we suggest that our customers irrigate between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., which is our optimum off-peak time.**

If a large percentage of our customers respond to the request, it will greatly enhance our system capabilities and extend the life of our equipment, **while also optimizing water pressure during the times when our customers need it most.** You, the customer, will be the ultimate beneficiary. Lower operating costs mean lower rates to our customers. Please help us serve you better.

Three Great Ways to Re-Use and Recycle Plastic Shopping Bags

1. Protect Your Paint Brushes and Rollers – When you're painting and take a break for lunch or a run to the hardware store, you can wrap your brushes and rollers in plastic bags to keep them from getting dry and hard. If you're only using one paint color, you can put them both in one bag. Your brushes and rollers will be ready to go you're ready to get back to it.

2. Line a Paint Tray – Next time you're painting a room, use a plastic bag to line the paint pan rather than a disposable plastic pan liner. It takes less plastic, protects your pan, and makes clean-up a breeze!

3. Get Creative! – In the mood to try something different on your walls? Try for a textured look by using bunched up plastic bags as your paint application tool instead of a brush or roller. Look to the internet for a wide range of techniques that are sure to give your walls a distinctive and unique look.
