- I. Perspective
 - A. Quote: "Live as though Christ is coming tonight and plan as though he won't come in your lifetime."
 - B. The importance of perspective

It determines our priorities, actions, and view of ourselves and reality

C. Sources of perspective

Parents, friends, personal experiences

D. Perspectives on reality

materialistic, hedonistic, atheistic, agnostic

The Passage

- 4 key aspects of perspective
- I. Recognize that this world is not our home
 - A. v. 20: "Our citizenship is in heaven"
 - B. Analogy: When tourists travel to Zambia they always keep their passports with them. We should be more like that during our sojourn in this life (always keeping our heavenly citizenship close to our hearts and minds)
 - C. It's so tempting to focus on this life: success, comfort, etc
- II. Remember that Jesus will come for us
 - A. v. 20: we eagerly await a Savior from heavenly, the Lord Jesus Christ"
 - B. Jn 14:3: Jesus will prepare a place for us and then come back and take us there
 - C. We should live as though we can't wait to see him face to face
- III. Realize that we will be eternally transformed
 - A. v. 21: "who will transform our lowly bodies to be like his glorious body"
 - B. We'll have transformed bodies that don't break down like our current bodies
 - C. We'll have a transformed character
 - D. Our transformation has already begun
- IV. Respond by standing firm in our hope in Christ
 - A. v. 1: "stand firm in the Lord"
 - B. Realize that this world will never fill up the empty places we have (only Christ can do that)
 - C. We need a hope strong enough to carry us through the tough times
