ECCLESIASTES: THE SEARCH FOR A LIFE THAT MATTERS

I. <u>Introduction</u>: If you could write your own epitaph, what you want it to say; that is, what are things for which you want to be remembered?

II. Three Keys to understanding Ecclesiastes:

A. The beginning: "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity" (1:1)

B. <u>The conclusion</u>: "Fear God and keep His commandments (12:13-14).

C. Two repeated themes:

1. "Don't try to unscrew the inscrutable (3:10-11, 6:12, 7:13-14, 8:16-17, 11:5).

2. "Enjoy life while you can" (2:24-25, 3:12,13,22, 5:18-19, 8:15, 9:7-9).

- 1. What was the most helpful or compelling idea from Sunday's sermon?
- 2. Consider the epitaph question posed on Sunday: what are the things you most want to be remembered for?
- 3. Consider the conclusion of Ecclesiastes: "fear God and keep his commands." What do you feel called to do at this time in your life as a way of more deliberately fearing God and keeping his commands?
- 4. As you consider the Ecclesiastes theme of enjoying life while you can, what are some specific ways you'd like to intentionally pursue enjoying your life more at this time?
