THE PLAN

Two-year cycle of Bible passages

We have selected 32 Bible passages that are fundamental to the Christian life. We organized them into a two-year CrossWalk plan of 15-17 passages per year. Each passage is divided into age-appropriate sections, the older the child, the longer the passage. As kids advance through the grades, they revisit the same passages every two years, adding more verses to each passage. By 4th-5th grade, kids will have been taught (& hopefully, memorized) all 244 great verses!

For example, all grades will learn Psalm 1, but in progressive increments at each level:

K-1st grade kids just learn verses 1 & 2

2nd-3rd graders learn verses 1-3

4th-5th graders learn all 6 verses

Rotating through the 32 passages every two years fits reasonably well with budding reading abilities as kids progress from shorter to longer passages. They get a solid review of previous levels, which encourages success & long-term retention. Yet the challenge of adding new verses with each round provides refreshing depth into God's Word. Most of all, **we pray that the Holy Spirit will bring conviction from God's Word that ultimately helps lead to their salvation!**

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Teaching/learning verses:

On Sundays at CrossWalk, we teach the Bible Passages through fun and meaningful activities. Typically, we work on a passage for **2-4 weeks**. Depending on its length, we add 1-3 verses/week.

Grades K-1: average 1 verse per week

Grades 2-3: average 2 verses per week

Grades 4-5: average 3 verses per week

Reciting verses for rewards:

Also on Sundays, children can recite verses to their CrossWalk leaders for prizes! *Please help kids **keep track of CrossWalk books** to **practice at home** & **bring on Sundays** to get signed off for **PRIZES!***

THE BATTLE STARTS NOW!

The Word of God really *is* the priceless treasure it claims to be! Knowing Bible verses is a first step to digging up that treasure.

Kids' days can fill up with family & friend time, schoolwork, sports, lessons, TV, video games, etc. It's easy for them to feel too busy to learn the Bible. We parents and teachers must **help set high standards! Don't allow distractions** from learning God's Word.

Take full advantage of CrossWalk to help your child form these habits early!

Start at the CrossWalk, follow-up at home

Teach your kids to **keep track of their CrossWalk booklets** and encourage them to **practice at home**.

Print extra copies from the [HBC website](#) and **display verses where kids will see them** often – at the kitchen table (under a clear placemat?), child's bedroom wall, the car, on the bathroom mirror, etc.

Establish a **regular time to practice EVERY day** – 1st thing in the morning AND last thing at night, on the way to school or soccer practice, *before* turning on video game or tv, etc.

Encourage your child! Make practicing verses fun & positive. Add your own rewards* at home. You know best what motivates your child!

Memorize together! Learn the verses along with your child—the competition will be good for you, and such an encouragement to your child! **Talk together about what God's Word means to each of you.** Chant or sing verses together!

If memorizing Bible verses is a new skill, or a major challenge, help your child **set a personal goal**. Encourage him/her to earn your rewards* for at least part of a CrossWalk Passage. Eventually build up to learn entire passages.

Studying at home is the real key to success!

NASB BIBLE TRANSLATION

We have chosen to use the New American Standard Bible® (NASB® 1995) version for our CrossWalk program. NASB is considered a more accurate word-for-word, modern English translation of the original Greek and Hebrew text which avoids paraphrasing or watering down God's Word. It is used by many preachers and teachers at Hillview. The 1995 version remains widely preferred by serious Bible students and publishers for inductive study.

We recognize that NASB is written to a higher reading level than other versions. We find most kids handle it just fine for rote memorization. Familiarity with NASB wording from a young age may smooth their transition to deeper understanding of God & His Word through to adulthood. If you want your child to use a different version, please realize that it may be confusing, as we'll practice NASB 1995 verses in CrossWalk.

PRAY FOR RESULTS

Ultimately, **pray for your child's salvation** as the fruit of knowing and accepting the gospel of His Word!

In faith, let's teach kids to look for God's hand in helping to memorize and understand His Word. Help them apply its truths to daily life. Beyond prizes, may the **true benefits be their salvation** and a lifelong desire to **hide God's Word in their hearts** and **abide in the Lord** always.
