Facts on John and His Gospel

- One of the disciples, brother of James, Sons of Thunder
- Disciple whom Jesus loved, who leaned on Jesus breast
- Became key figure in church, also wrote 1,2 & 3 John
- Wrote Gospel ~90 A.D.:
 - All gospels have conversations/dialogues, dominates John
 - No parables and only 7 miracles
 - Most theological of the gospels



Jesus, the Son of God –the “I AM” of the OT!

- ...the bread of life, which came down from heaven (6:35, 41, 48, 51)
- ...the light of the world (8:12, 9:5)
- ...the deliverer from dying in sins (8:24)
- ...the lifted-up Son of Man (8:28)
- ...the self existent one, predating Father Abraham (8:58)
- ...the door (10:7,9)
- ...the good shepherd (10:11,14)
- ...the resurrection and the life (11:25)
- ...the foreteller of his own betrayer (13:19)
- ...the way, the truth, and the life (14:6)
- ...the true vine (15:1,5)
- ...the allowing of his own arrest, Jesus of Nazareth (18:5-8)



Ch. 1: Jesus – The Disciple Caller

35 Again, the next day, John stood with two of his disciples.

36 And looking at Jesus as He walked, he said, “Behold the Lamb of God!”

37 The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

38 Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them,

“What do you seek?”

They said to Him, “Rabbi” (which is to say, when translated, Teacher),

“where are You staying?”

39 He said to them, “Come and see.”

They came and saw where He was staying, and remained with Him that day...

Ch. 2: Jesus - The Game Changer

*⁹ When the master of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine,
and did not know where it came from
(but the servants who had drawn the water knew),
the master of the feast called the bridegroom.*

*¹⁰ And he said to him, “Every man at the beginning sets out the good wine,
and when the guests have well drunk, then the inferior.
You have kept the good wine until now!”*

Ch. 3: Jesus – The Declarer of New Birth

There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews.

² This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him,

*“Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God;
for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him.”*

*³ Jesus answered and said to him, “Most assuredly, I say to you,
unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.”*

*⁴ Nicodemus said to Him, “How can a man be born when he is old?
Can he enter a second time into his mother’s womb and be born?”*

*⁵ Jesus answered, “Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water
and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.*

Ch. 4: Jesus – the Cross-Cultural Evangelist

³ He left Judea and departed again to Galilee.

⁴ But He needed to go through Samaria.

*⁵ So He came to a city of Samaria which is called Sychar,
near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.*

*⁶ Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from His journey,
sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour.*

⁷ A woman of Samaria came to draw water.

Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink."

Ch. 7: Jesus – the Fountain of Living Waters

37 On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying,

“If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink.

38 He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.”

39 But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Ch. 9: Jesus – Revealing the Works of God

Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth.

² And His disciples asked Him, saying,

“Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?”

³ Jesus answered, “Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him. ⁴ I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work.

⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.”

⁶ When He had said these things, He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva; and He anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay. ⁷ And He said to him, “Go, wash in the pool of Siloam” (which is translated, Sent).

So he went and washed and came back seeing.

Ch. 10: Jesus - The Good Shepherd

*⁷ Then Jesus said to them again, "Most assuredly, I say to you,
I am the door of the sheep.*

*⁸ All who ever came before Me are thieves and robbers,
but the sheep did not hear them.*

*⁹ I am the door. If anyone enters by Me,
he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture.*

*¹⁰ The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy.
I have come that they may have life,
and that they may have it more abundantly.*

*¹¹ "I am the good shepherd.
The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep*

Ch. 11: Jesus – The Resurrection & The Life

23 Jesus said to her, “Your brother will rise again.”

***24 Martha said to Him, “I know that he will rise again
in the resurrection at the last day.”***

***25 Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life.
He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live.***

26 And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?”

***27 She said to Him, “Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ,
the Son of God, who is to come into the world.”***

Ch. 12: Jesus – the Grain of Wheat that Dies

²⁰ Now there were certain Greeks among those who came up to worship at the feast.

²¹ Then they came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida of Galilee, and asked him, saying, “Sir, we wish to see Jesus.”

²² Philip came and told Andrew, and in turn Andrew and Philip told Jesus.

²³ But Jesus answered them, saying,

“The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified.

²⁴ Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain.

²⁵ He who loves his life will lose it,

and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

²⁶ If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor.
