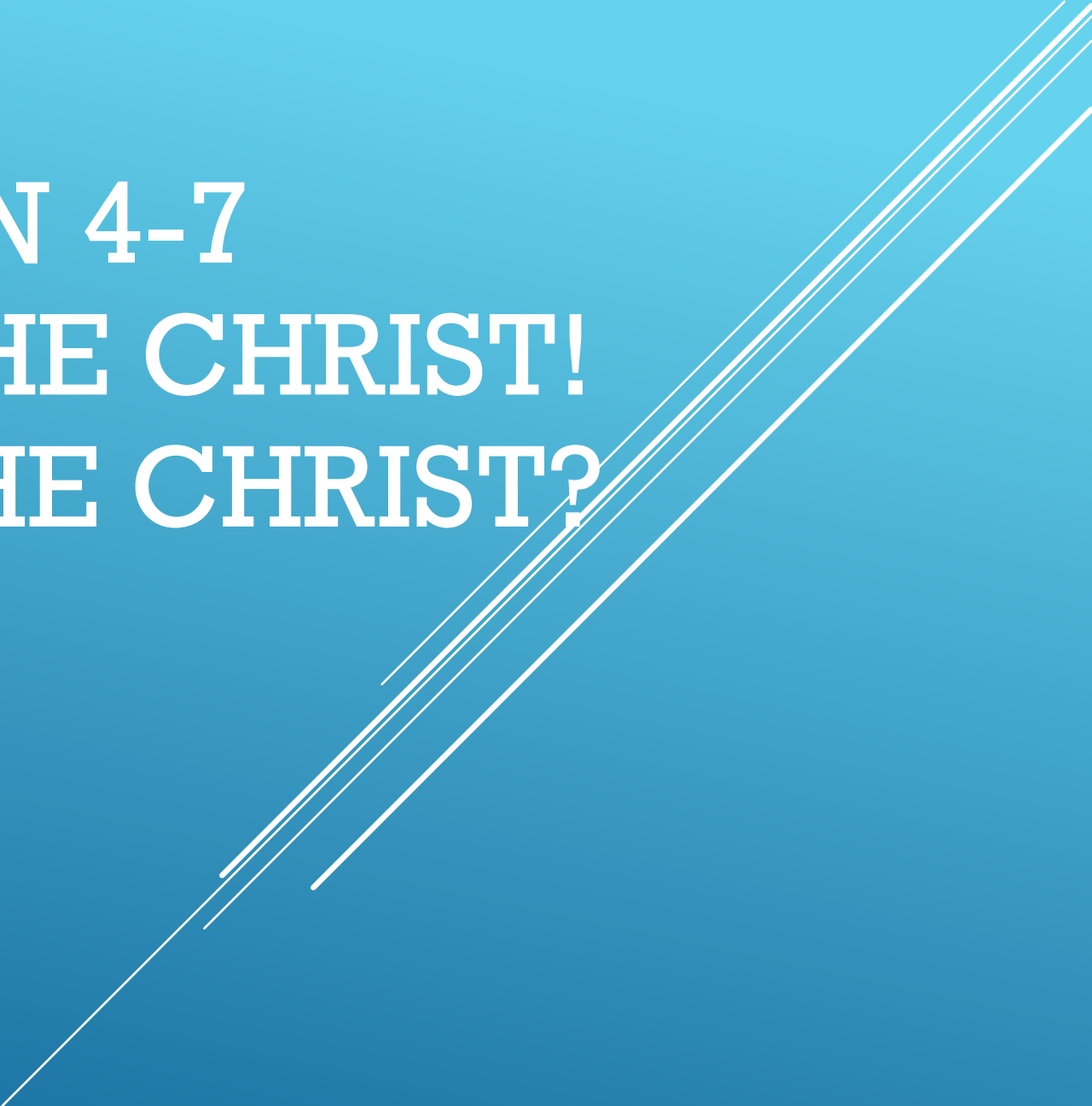

KEY THINGS WE READ ABOUT JESUS IN JOHN 4-7

- Transcends social & cultural barriers.
- Heals.
- Does miracles.
- Provokes the people in emotion & thought.
- Gives evidence He is the Christ.

KEY WORD: WATER

- Water used 16 times in some type of form. 10 times in chapter 4, 4 times in chapter 5, none in chapter 6 but he walk on water, 1 time in chapter 7.
- Key verses with water are John 4:13-14

¹³ Jesus answered and said to her, “Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life.”

John 7:37-38

³⁷ Now on the last day, the great *day* of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. ³⁸ He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, ‘From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.’”

KEY WORD: BREAD

- Bread used 17 times and all in chapter 6.
- Key verses with water are John 6:35, 41, 48 & 51

³⁵ Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me will not hunger, and he who believes in Me will never thirst.

⁴¹ Therefore the Jews were grumbling about Him, because He said, “I am the bread that came down out of heaven.”

⁴⁸ I am the bread of life.

⁵¹ I am the living bread that came down out of heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread also which I will give for the life of the world is My flesh.”

KEY WORD: TRULY & TRULY, TRULY

- Truly used 2 times chapter 4:18 & 6:14.

John 4:14 for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; this you have said truly.”

John 6:14 Therefore when the people saw the sign which He had performed, they said, “This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world.”

- Truly, truly used 7 times, 3 in chapter 5 & 4 in chapter 6

²⁴ “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears My word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into life.

⁴⁷ Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life.

KEY WORD: CHRIST

- Christ used 8 times. 2 times in chapter 4 and 6 times in chapter 7.

John 4:

25 The woman *said to Him, “I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when that One comes, He will declare all things to us.” 26 Jesus *said to her, “I who speak to you am *He*.”

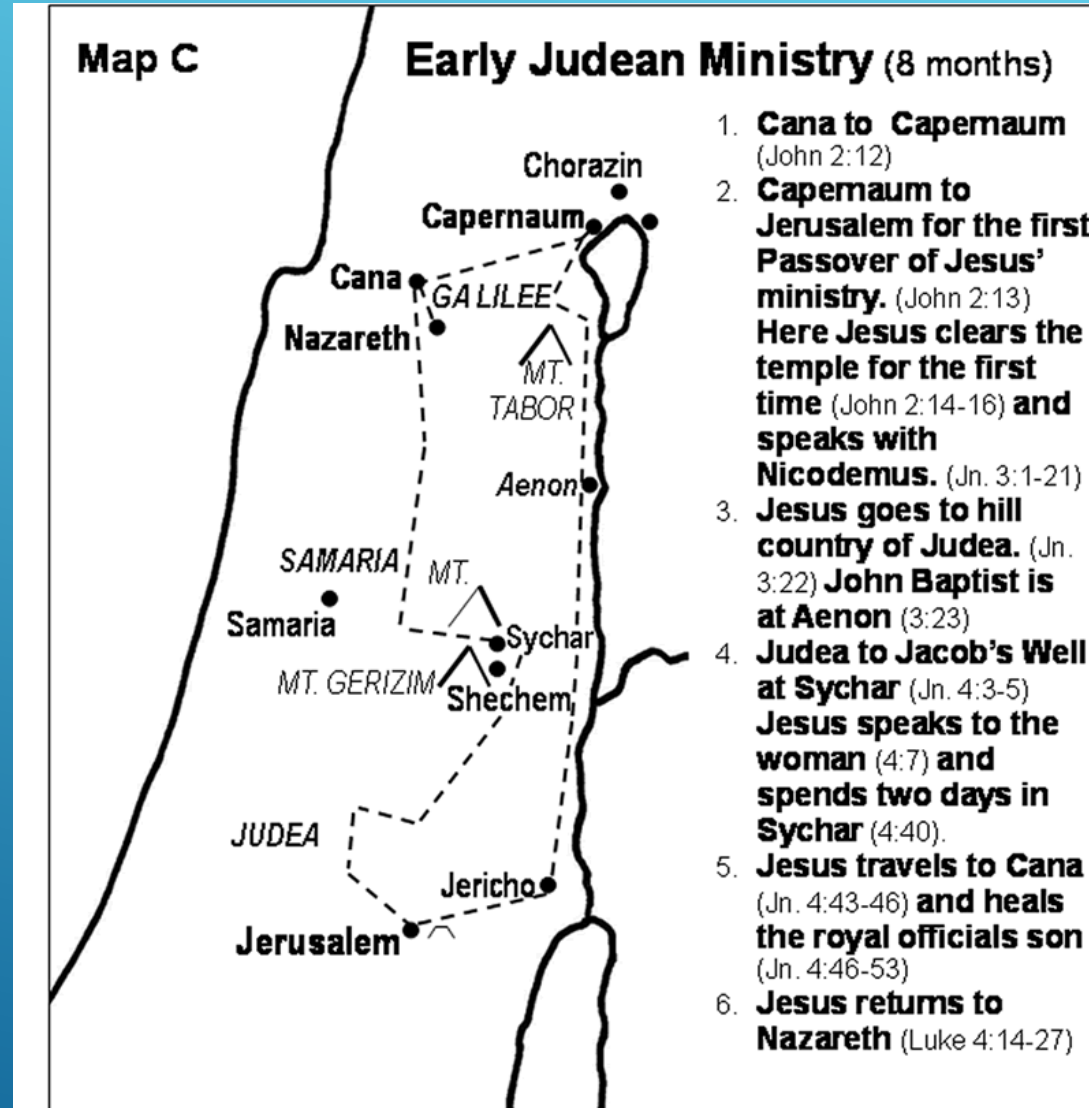
29 “Come, see a man who told me all the things that I *have* done; this is not the Christ, is it?”

John 7:

31 But many of the crowd believed in Him; and they were saying, “When the Christ comes, He will not perform more signs than those which this man has, will He?”

41 Others were saying, “This is the Christ.” Still others were saying, “Surely the Christ is not going to come from Galilee, is He? 42 Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the descendants of David, and from Bethlehem, the village where David was?”

JESUS TRAVELS FROM JUDEA TO GALILEE



JOHN CHAPTER 4

- (1-4) Jesus travels from Judea to Galilee, passing through Samaria.
- (5-6) Jesus comes to a well in Sychar of Samaria.
 - Jesus is tired and at well. Time is around 6pm
- (7-14) Jesus speaks and interacts with a Samaritan woman.
 - Jesus starts conversation with woman by asking for drink of water.
 - Samaritan woman shocked by Jesus talking to her since a Samaritan.
 - Jesus' reply:

¹⁰ Jesus answered and said to her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, ‘Give Me a drink,’ you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.” ¹¹ She **said* to Him, “Sir, You have nothing to draw with and the well is deep; where then do You get that living water? ¹² You are not greater than our father Jacob, are You, who gave us the well, and drank of it himself and his sons and his cattle?” ¹³ **Jesus answered and said to her, “Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life.”**

JOHN CHAPTER 4

- (15-26) Jesus continues conversation with a Samaritan woman.
 - Samaritan woman want living water and ask for it from Jesus
 - Jesus ask before they future conversing with her, she should get husband. Jesus reveals how well he really know hers and His power. She is probably very surprised why he started conversation since she is considered very unclean but since He has not left ask Jesus deeper questions.
 - Samaritan woman's question and Jesus' reply:

²⁰ Our fathers worshiped in this mountain, and you *people* say that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship." ²¹ Jesus *said to her, "Woman, believe Me, an hour is coming when neither in this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. ²² You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ But an hour is coming, and now is, when **the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth**; for such people the Father seeks to be His worshipers. ²⁴ **God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.**" ²⁵ The woman *said to Him, "I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when that One comes, He will declare all things to us." ²⁶ **Jesus *said to her, "I who speak to you am He."**

JOHN CHAPTER 4

- (27-30) Samaritan woman tells her neighbors about Jesus being the Christ.
 - The disciples shocked that Jesus was talking to woman but did not ask why.
 - Woman waterpot and went to tell all she could about Jesus and witness for themselves.
- (31-34) Jesus teaches His disciples the source of His strength and satisfaction.
 - Disciple what Jesus to eat but he lets them know His food is to do Father's work.
- (35-38) Jesus teaches His disciples about the urgency of spiritual work and opportunity.
- (39-42) Many Samaritans believe on the Savior of the world.
- ⁴¹ Many more believed because of His word; ⁴² and they were saying to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves and know that this One is indeed the Savior of the world."
- (43-45) Jesus goes to Galilee where he know he not honored since raise there.
- (46-54) Healing of the nobleman's son.

⁴⁷ When he heard that Jesus had come out of Judea into Galilee, he went to Him and was **imploring *Him to come down and heal his son***; for he was at the **point of death**. ⁴⁸ So Jesus said to him, "**Unless you *people* see *signs and wonders*, you *simply* will not believe.**"

JOHN CHAPTER 5

- (1-9) Jesus heals ill/sick man at Bethesda.
 - Many sick, blind, lame and withered would go to pool to be healed.
 - Man could get to pool for healing. Was in condition for 38 years.
 - Jesus said to him, "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."
- (10-17) Controversy on healing on Sabbath
 - Religious Jews had issue with healing on Sabbath.
 - When they found out it was Jesus they started persecuting for doing this.
 - Jesus focus to do Father's work.
- (18-23) Jesus' Equality with God & relationship with Father

¹⁸ For this reason therefore the Jews were seeking all the more to kill Him, because He not only was breaking the Sabbath, but also was calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God.

JOHN CHAPTER 5

- (24-27) From death to life in the Son of God.
- **24 “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who hears My word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into life.**
- (28-30) The reality of the Son’s coming judgment.
- (31-39) The testimony to who truthfully testify of Jesus are.
 - John the Baptist.
 - Works of Jesus.
 - The Father.
 - The Scriptures.
- (41-47) Reason for those who have unbelief in Jesus.
 - They look for man’s approval not God’s.
 - Not understanding what Moses wrote about Jesus.

46 For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me. 47 But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?”

JOHN CHAPTER 6

- (1-13) Jesus feeds Five Thousand.
 - Crowd gathers to Jesus near the Sea of Galilee
 - Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread, so that these may eat?"
 - Jesus blesses 5 barley loaves and 2 fish from lad. All get feed with 12 baskets to spare.
 - (14-15) The reaction to the miracle.
 - Saw Jesus as Prophet.
 - Want to make Him king.
 - (16-25) Jesus Walks on Water.
 - The disciples go out on the Sea of Galilee and wind disrupts their efforts to cross the Sea.
 - Jesus comes to His disciples, walking on the water and were calmed by Jesus words.
- ²⁰ But He *said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid.

JOHN CHAPTER 6

- (26-59) Jesus is the bread of life.
 - Crowd seeks Jesus not just because of miracle with feeding 5 thousand but they ate bread and were filled
 - Jesus encourage to work for food that will last not that will perish
 - Jesus refer to past with manna in the wilderness. He is like the manna and is true bread of life.
- 38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me.
- Jews reject & grumble about what Jesus says about Him being bread that come down from heaven. He is Joseph's son.
- 47 Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life.
- Jews and other did not understand what Jesus meant by eating his flesh and drinking His blood meant.
- 53 So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in yourselves.

JOHN CHAPTER 6

(60-71) Reacting to the Radical Statements of Jesus.

- Many disciples turn away. Did not understand or drawn to message.
- 12 stayed even though they did not completely understand message

⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered Him, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have believed and have come to know that You are the Holy One of God.”

- The 12 were chosen even the one who will betray Jesus.

JOHN CHAPTER 7

- (1-39) Jesus Teaches at the Feast.

- Jews in Judea seeking to kill Jesus.
- Jesus family had doubt about Him

⁵ For not even His brothers were believing in Him.

- Jesus answers objections and teaches.

- The religious leaders object that Jesus isn't educated. (14-18)
- The people object that Jesus is crazy, and has a demon (19-24)
- The people of Jerusalem object that Jesus could not be the Messiah because they know where He came from. (25-29)
- The officers try to arrest Jesus as many believe in Him. (30-36)

JOHN CHAPTER 7

- (37-39) Great Invitation from Jesus.
- ³⁷ Now on the last day, the great *day* of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. ³⁸ He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, ‘From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.’” ³⁹ But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive; for the Spirit was not yet *given*, because Jesus was not yet glorified.
- (40-52) The crowd questions, the religious leaders reject.
 - Jesus brings division among the crowd.

“This certainly is the Prophet.” ⁴¹ Others were saying, “This is the Christ.” Still others were saying, “Surely the Christ is not going to come from Galilee, is He?” ⁴² Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the descendants of David, and from Bethlehem, the village where David was?” ⁴³ So a division occurred in the crowd because of Him. ⁴⁴ Some of them wanted to seize Him, but no one laid hands on Him.
