

WORLD SHOWCASE PROGRAM AT HOT DOCS OFFERS GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES ON ISSUES FACING DIVERSE COMMUNITIES FROM 31 COUNTRIES

Toronto, March 28, 2023 – Hot Docs will share compelling and diverse stories from around the world as part of the Festival's 2023 **World Showcase** program. Featuring 21 feature films, four mid-length films, and 12 shorts, this year's World Showcase includes works from 31 countries, including Afghanistan, Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Central African Republic, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, India, Iran, Iraq, Ireland, Italy, Mexico, Mongolia, Netherlands, New Zealand, Philippines, Qatar, Senegal, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, UK and the USA. The 2023 Hot Docs Festival, this year celebrating its 30th anniversary, will take place April 27 to May 7 in Toronto.

"Each year, the World Showcase program at Hot Docs offers audiences a carefully curated selection of works that provide great insight into crucial issues impacting the globe today," said **Shane Smith**, Hot Docs artistic director. "Through these films, we gain not only a greater understanding of the issues facing our global community, but a chance to experience unique perspectives and storytelling from filmmakers at the forefront of the international documentary movement."

This year's 30th-anniversary edition of the World Showcase program includes the world premieres of **After the Bridge**, a nuanced and humanizing portrait of a shocked mother finding peace with her son, a jihadist killed in the 2017 London Bridge attack; **Allihopa: The Dalkurd Story**, in which Kurdish refugees come together to form a professional soccer team in Sweden in a shared fight for both independence and victory on the pitch; **Jackie the Wolf**, an unconventional conversation between the filmmaker and his mother who, as part of a refusal to live beyond a certain age, has announced her death date despite not being terminally ill; **The Lebanese Burger Mafia**, in which the filmmaker—heiress to a Burger Baron franchise—chases clues through rural Alberta to uncover the saga of a rogue fast-food chain with mysterious origins; **Razing Liberty Square**, a look at the oldest segregated public housing project in the Southern USA as it faces gentrification and climate change with wealthy Miami developers circling like sharks; **Rowdy Girl**, the story of a former Texas cattle rancher turned animal sanctuary operator as she encourages farmers to transition to plant-based food production, and **Sleepless Birds**, a look at how the rise of industrial greenhouses in the French region of Bretagne are bringing dire consequences for the region's biodiversity.

International premieres include **Is My Living in Vain**, linking communities in West Philadelphia and South East London in a poetic meditation on the living history and freedom potential of the Black church; and **A Mother, Youngsoon**, in which a North Korean defector works tirelessly at construction sites and in a food truck to support her family.

The program will also feature a selection of captivating European shorts as part of the **World Showcase Shorts Program**, with others sprinkled throughout the program and screening with feature and mid-length films.


