Marking its fifth year as one of the world's premier audio events, the Hot Docs Podcast Festival will celebrate the visceral power of audio storytelling and explore how the innovative medium continues to thrive in our new socially distanced reality. Featuring a dynamic mix of specially curated live conversations and ondemand sessions, this year's Podcast Festival will dive into the creative process of today's chart-topping podcasters, revealing how they use the medium to tell the complex and layered stories impacting us today. Accessible through one easy pass, with a select number of events available for single purchase, the Hot Docs Podcast Festival will be available to stream on the Hot Docs website at hotdocscinema.ca.

"During this unpredictable year of social distancing, podcasts have become essential listening for their much-needed moments of insight, humour, humanity and escape," said Alan Black, Managing Director of Hot Docs Ted Rogers Cinema. "Given this, there was no question that we had to move our signature Podcast Festival online. This way, we could bring together and expand our community of pod lovers globally, as well as welcome exciting storytellers who may not have been able to appear live in Toronto. Over the past few months, we have worked tirelessly to curate an incredible lineup that will speak to the power of audio to move, delight and connect us in this new reality."

Featuring an outstanding roster of thought leaders, cultural commentators and audio artists, the Hot Docs Podcast Festival will welcome former Obama administration officials, Crooked Media's Tommy Vietor and Tanya Somanader (*Pod Save America*), to discuss the future of politics and the media in a post-Trump America; bestselling author and *Hear to Slay* podcast host Roxane Gay, who will reveal her latest cultural and political obsessions with *The Cut* podcast; 99% *Invisible* host Roman Mars, who will talk about how his wildly popular podcast is expanding with the release of his new book, *The 99% Invisible City*; *Reply All*'s new co-host Emmanuel Dzotsi and producer Anna Foley, who will delve into their creative process and the evolution of their ever-innovative show; Chana Joffe-Walt, host of *Nice White Parents*, and Nikole Hannah-Jones, host of *1619*, will candidly discuss how they're using their podcasts to advance the conversation about race; Connie Walker, host of CBC's *Missing & Murdered* and new investigative podcast on Gimlet, will speak about the erasure of women of colour from true crime stories; and CBC's flagship pop culture show *Pop Chat* joins forces with Apple Podcast's cult phenom *You're Wrong About* to explore the rise of pop culture nostalgia.



The program's on-demand sessions will include quickfire rounds of 20 questions with podcasting talent from acclaimed shows such as *Ear Hustle, The Allusionist,* CBC's *This is not a Drake podcast, Snap Judgment, Lost Notes, The Memory Palace,* CBC's *The Secret Life of Canada* and more. Passholders will also receive access to two exclusive listening parties that will preview some of the most anticipated podcasts set for release this year.
