BIG IDEAS SERIES RETURNS TO HOT DOCS FESTIVAL IN 2025

Toronto, March 25, 2025 - Hot Docs announced today the return of the staple Festival series **Big Ideas**. The popular series—now entering its 12th year—is part of the 2025 Hot Docs Festival, April 25 to May 5 in Toronto. Big Ideas offers audiences the opportunity to experience four thought-provoking documentaries and then hear, first-hand, from the notable subjects and experts on the issues featured in the films.

The 2025 Big Ideas series presents a compelling lineup of inspiring and compelling stories, from the politically charged artistry of Ai Weiwei through a reimagining of Puccini's *Turandot* to the dangerous world of investigative journalism in today's volatile landscape. The series will also explore Oscar-winning actor Marlee Matlin's trailblazing career, her advocacy for the Deaf community and women's rights—and examine the complexities of dating in modern-day China.
