Curious Minds Festival will spotlight stories, voices, issues and ideas that shape our present and challenge us to think deeply about the world we inhabit.

Confirmed to participate in the four-day event are creators, artists, change makers and thought leaders, all of whom will share their experience and expertise live on stage with inquisitive audiences.
