- The hottest new docs from across the globe premiering at Hot Docs Cinema in September: Aurora's Sunrise—Armenia's submission to the 95th Academy Awards for Best International Film—the story of a genocide survivor who becomes a silent movie star in Hollywood; In the Company of Rose, Tony-winning playwright and director James Lepine's touching portrait of Rose Styron, the widow of the great American novelist William Styron (Sophie's Choice); The Pawnshop, a darkly funny doc about Europe's biggest pawnshop as it finds itself on the brink of bankruptcy; Mr. Jimmy, about Japanese guitarist Akio Sakurai, who has dedicated his life to emulating iconic Led Zeppelin guitarist Jimmy Page; The YouTube Effect, an eye-opening documentary that presents a troubling look at the popular video platform; and Radical Wolfe, a personal and illuminating look at American novelist, journalist, and social commentator Tom Wolfe's life and work.
- Hot Docs Cinema celebrates important local stories: In *Charlotte's Castle*, a quirky cast of Annex neighbours become unlikely activists when they wage a war with a foreign-owned developer seeking to destroy the cultural landmark of which they consider themselves the caretakers.
- The Cinema commemorates National Day for Truth and Reconciliation with a theatrical run of Bad Press, an enthralling nail biter that chronicles the long fight for free press on the Muscogee Nation reservation in Oklahoma. The September 30, 2:30 p.m. screening will be FREE and will feature an introduction by imagineNATIVE Film + Media Arts Festival and post-screening virtual Q&A with co-director Joe Peeler in recognition of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.
- Art aficionados will get the chance to experience the sold-out exhibition of the century in *Exhibition on Screen: Vermeer: The Greatest Exhibition*.
- **The Last Rider**—the incredible story of the greatest cycling race in history, in which American Greg LeMond vanquished his demons in one of the most inspiring comebacks in sporting history—returns for a series of Encore screenings in September.

Since assuming management in 2012, Hot Docs has screened over 1,425 films to audiences of more than 1.3 million. In 2016, a generous \$5-million donation from Rogers Foundation enabled Hot Docs to purchase venue.
