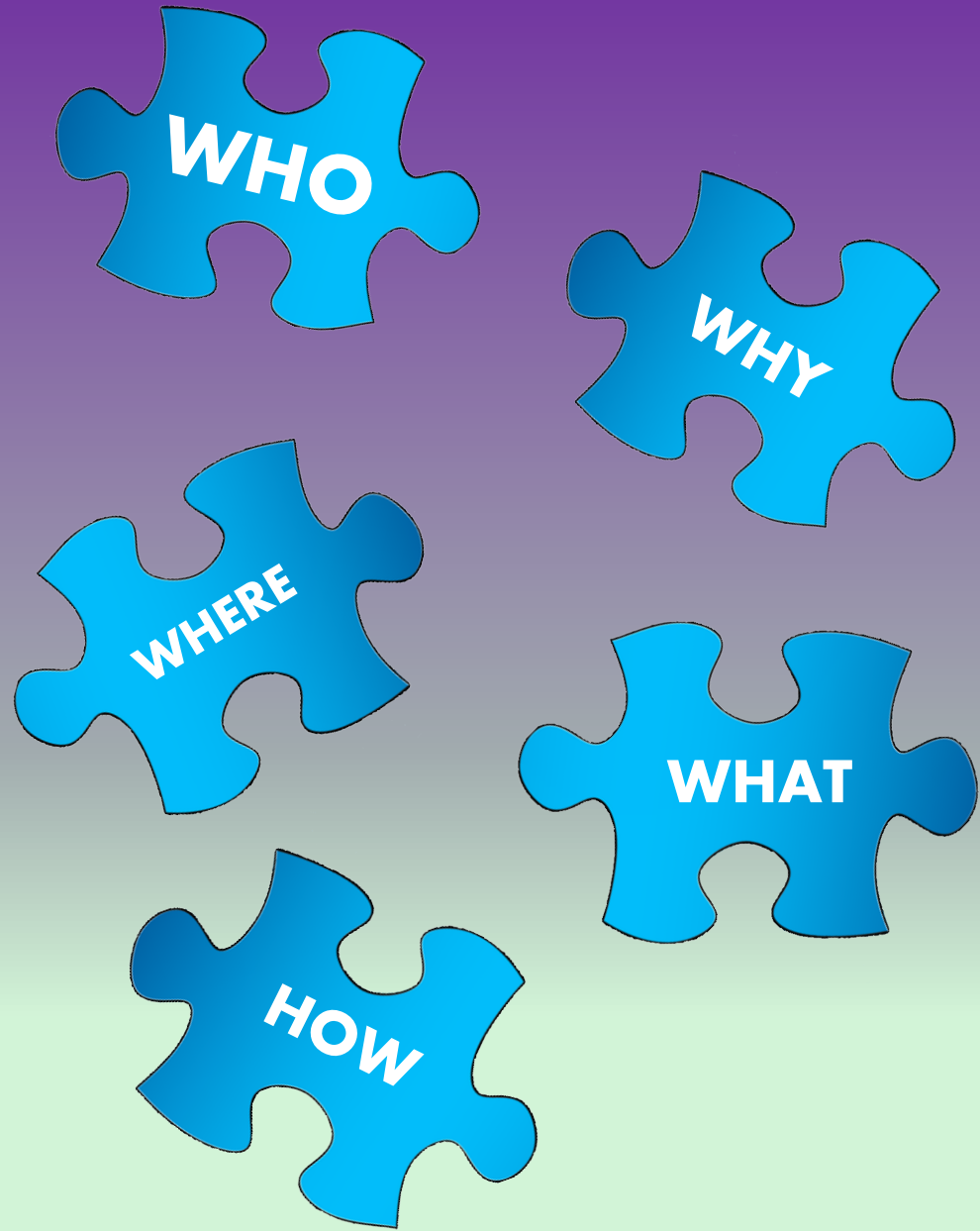

Embroidery Topping



Solvy™ (wash-away topping) is the most common topping used in the embroidery industry.



Solvy™ is available in different thicknesses, textures and suggested uses.



Even using Solvvy™ (wash-away topping) on plush materials (deep pile fabrics), once Solvvy™ is removed and dissolved, stitches can disappear in the material and become
HIDDEN.

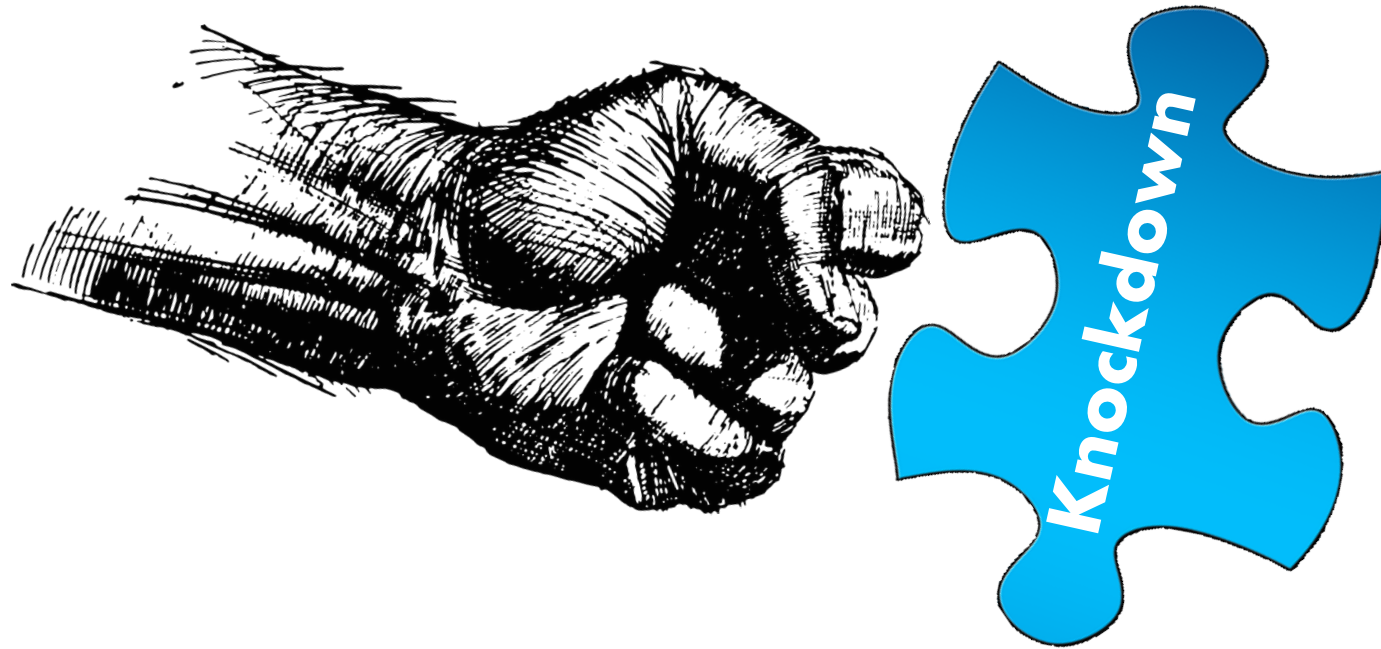
Embroidery Stitch – The Knockdown Stitch



Crisp, clean, easy to read logos.

Embroidery Stitch – The Knockdown Stitch

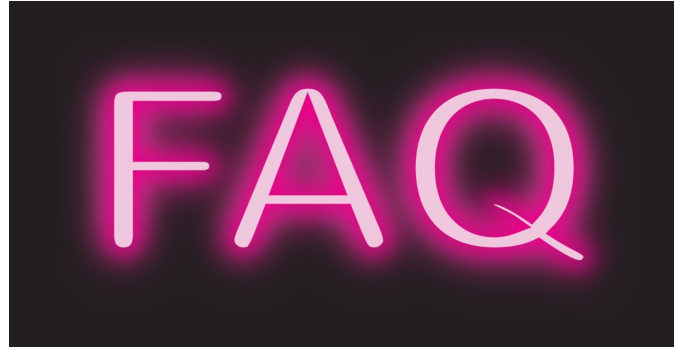
The Knockdown Stitch is a base layer of stitching designed to be sewn under the embroidery design, logo, monogram, etc. The function of the knockdown stitch is to hold down the pile of fabric to make the design look more prominent.



Pro Tip

Match the thread color with the material for blending purposes.

Embroidery Stitch – Knockdown Stitch Questions



1. What is the difference between a knockdown stitch and a regular fill stitch?
 - ❖ The density – the knockdown stitch is a light fill while a regular fill stitch is denser.
2. Do I need special embroidery software?
 - ❖ Yes, you do. A knockdown stitch can also be referred to as a basting or laydown stitch.
3. How do I add the knockdown stitch to a design?
 - ❖ It can be created before or after design. If after the design, re-sequence the knockdown to sew first that is slightly larger than the design itself.

Embroidery Stitch – Knockdown Stitch

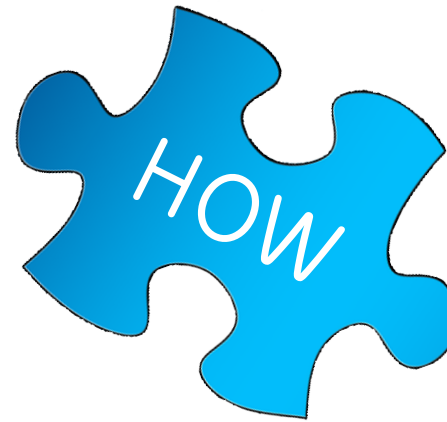


The Knock Down Stitch is sewn before the logo
Matching the color of the material.



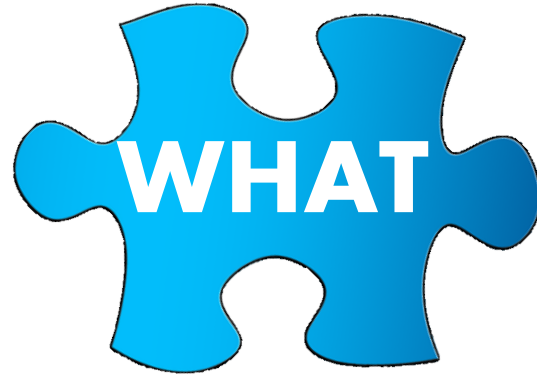
Solvvy™ can also be used as a backing. Especially when the reverse side of embroidery is exposed.

Hoop Solvy™ with fabric before starting embroidery design.

Another Embroidery Topping: Thermogaze™



Thermogaze™ - a topping or backing to be used when the embroidery garment cannot get wet.



Thermogaze™ - Heat-Away product for embroidering garments. It can also be used for Free Standing Lace.

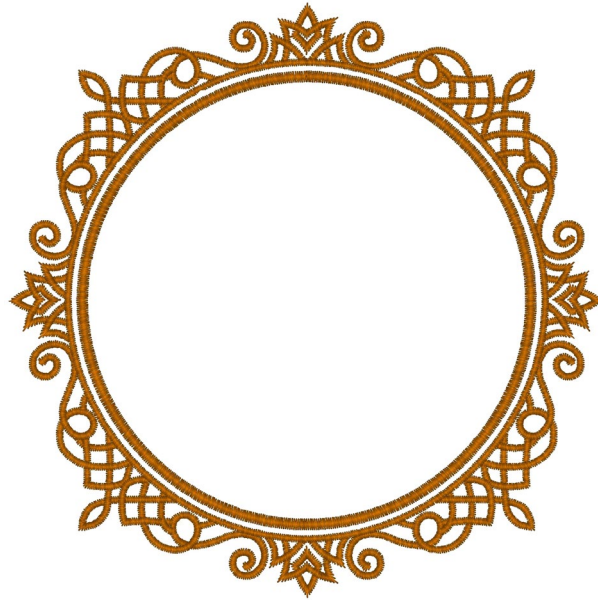
