Program Director's Note

My sincere thanks to all the dedicated supporters of Sewa International's Sponsor A Child program. Thanks to our generous donors, we have been growing our program in all dimensions since 2009, while contributing in a small way to eradicate childhood illiteracy.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to my fellow donors Gayatri Yoga Center, Kiev, Ukraine, for providing seed funds to expand the SaC program; Anil Damani from Georgia for supporting 100 tribal children from Madhya Pradesh, New York Metro Sewa Chapter for sponsoring 50 children from rural and tribal places in Telangana, Pramod Sajja from Georgia for sponsoring 25 tribal children from North Karnataka; Ananda Rajagopal from California for sponsoring 18 tribal children from Mysore; Shirim Foundation from Ohio for sponsoring 12 children from Bengaluru; Veerashaiva Samaj of North America, Connecticut Chapter, for sponsoring 10 tribal children from Mysuru and our 357 donors who are changing 1403 lives from all over India.

Sewa International believes in providing a wellrounded holistic education through the Sponsor A Child program. Children in our learning centers take active part in both academic curriculum and extracurricular activities such as dancing, singing, debates, sports and other workshops.

Sponsorships: This year, we added 140 new sponsorships via our website. With a few more enhancements coming in the next few months, we hope to add a lot more new sponsorships during 2019.

Geographic presence: During the course of the year, we have added the Ekalavya Vidya Sankul learning center from Yamgarwadi village, Maharashtra and Bhagini Niveditha Balika Avasam

from Jagtial, Telangana to our pool of beneficiaries. With this, our program now has it's presence in six Indian states - Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Telangana, and Uttar Pradesh.

Technology: During April this year, we were able to overhaul the technology (frontend + backend) for managing all aspects of Sponsor A Child. Together with our new technology partner Atulsia, we are now in a much better position to handle the ever increasing amounts of data being handled by the website. We hope that the donors appreciate the improved visibility and transparency with respect to child availability, receipts and overall program statistics.

Video Calls: During 2018, we conducted video calls with students in 13 learning centers across Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and donors from Atlanta, New Jersey, California and children from Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana.

As a 501(c) (3) Hindu faith-based charitable nonprofit service organization, Sewa International runs a very tight ship with a low administrative cost of 7%. Sewa serves without discrimination of race, color, religion, sex, gender or national origin. As a humanitarian, charitable nonprofit we do not proselytize.

The new site enables


- ▶ The donors to communicate easily with the SaC team and the learning center incharges.

In the year 2018, we sponsored 1403 children, out of which 140 are new sponsorships.




Month-wise students sponsorship in 2018

SCIENCE FAIR

K.Sowjanya, class 9, Sri Saraswathi Shishumandir, Palvancha, Telangana got the First prize in Jnana Vijnana mela (All India Science Fair) conducted by Vidya Bharathi at Cuttack, Odisha from 17th to 20th Nov- 2018. She got the first prize at District, Zonal, State and South Central India levels to reach All India level.

She presented models based on waste material. With the help of teachers, she prepared around 75 different items with waste material such as news papers, hard sheets, used tooth brushes, injection bottles, paint buckets, used car tyres, garlic peal, used sarees, gunny bags, waste thermocol sheet, sea shells, coconut shell, pista shells, groundnut shells, used bangles, coconut thread, country twine etc.,

She hails from a farmer's family of Iravendi, a remote village near Bhadrachalam. Her parents are illiterate. She is studying in this school from class 5.

Sagar K A is a student from PathiAdinaranaiah School has scored 91% in the Grade 10 examination 2016-2017. Hardships were written in his life from an earlier age. His father passed away when he was very young. His mother Sujathamma is a farmer. He has one elder sister, who has completed Grade 10+2 this year.

With the income that his mother was earning, it was becoming more and more difficult for her to provide support to this child. It was at this moment that Sponsor A Child stepped up to help this child, and he has been very vocal with his appreciation towards the program.

Sagar has been scoring consistently well throughout his schooling. His hobbies are playing Cricket and Carom in free time.

A great appreciation also goes to his teacher, Mr. Shankar Reddy V.N who selflessly helped this child by giving him time after school to help him with his studies. His unshaken determination abled him to secure 91% percent in SSLC exams. This result has emboldened him to pursue his dream of becoming a Successful Engineer one day.







Child Development Activities

SaC program provides basic educational access and aims at holistic development of a child.

SaC sponsored students in Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, and Bangalore are provided with a school kit at the start of the year. The school kit consists of a bag, notebooks, pen/pencil, dictionary, and water bottle. The contents are customized according to the needs in the location.

The SaC program aims to provide holistic education to the sponsored students. We encourage and fund the hostels to provide coaching on co-curricular and extracurricular activities such as drawing, performance arts (traditional dances, etc.), and sports.

Republic Day, Independence Day, International Yoga Day, Annual Day, Holi, and other major celebrations were celebrated in all our learning centers and children participate in various cultural activities.

Starting 2019, the donors can call the hostel incharge on the first sunday of every month and interact with their sponsored child. The donors can communicate with the hostel incharge through the new SaC website and arrange the call.

PERSONAL INTERACTIONS

One of the donors requested Sewa if her son could be a pen pal with the sponsored child. We were able to set it up through our new site enabling the two children to communicate. We hope that this initiative helps the children to share their common interests and foster a deeper relationship.






From the SaC-supported learning centers in Karnataka and Telangana, 59 students appeared for Grade 10 exams.
