Director's Note

It gives me great pleasure to have concluded another successful year of running the Sponsor A Child program. Thanks to our loyal donors and their generous contributions since 2009, we have been able to help in reducing Learning Poverty*. On behalf of the Sponsor A Child team, I'm very grateful for all the support we continue to receive.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to my fellow donors Gayatri Yoga Center, Kiev, Ukraine, for providing seed funds to expand the SaC program; Anil Damani from Georgia for supporting 100 tribal children from Madhya Pradesh, New York/New Jersey Sewa Chapters for sponsoring 100 children from rural and tribal places in Telangana, Arvind Sodhani from California for supporting 30 tribal children in Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh, Pramod Sajja from Georgia for sponsoring 25 tribal children from North Karnataka; Ananda Rajagopal from California for sponsoring 18 tribal children from Mysore; Shirim Foundation from Ohio for sponsoring 12 children from Bengaluru; Veerashaiva Samaj of North America, Connecticut Chapter, for sponsoring 10 tribal children from Mysuru and our 357 donors who are changing 1500+ lives from all over India.

Sewa International believes in providing a well-rounded holistic education through the Sponsor A Child program. Children in our learning centers take an active part in both academic curriculum and extracurricular activities such as dancing, singing, debates, sports, arts, crafts, and other workshops.

Sponsorships: This year, we added 141 new sponsorships via our website. With a few more enhancements coming in the next few months, we hope to have a larger increase in new sponsorships during 2020.

Geographic presence: During the course of the year, we have added four new learning centers – 2 in Maharashtra and 1 each in Karnataka and Arunachal Pradesh. In 2019, we served in Arunchal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Telangana and Uttar Pradesh.

Transparency: Starting October 2019, we have been providing monthly newsletter updates to our donors and supporters. We have received a very positive response from our donors and the same is reflected by way of improved program statistics.



Video Calls: We continue to arrange video calls between sponsored students and donors on the first weekend of every month. This year, donors from Atlanta, California, New Jersey, Texas spoke to the children from the learning centers in Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, and Uttar Pradesh

As a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit service organization, Sewa International runs a very tight ship with a low administrative cost of 7%. Sewa serves without discrimination of race, color, religion, sex, gender or national origin.




Gender Sponsorship



New Sponsorship this year





Addressing Learning Poverty

All school going children should be able to read by age 10. Even though the majority of children are in school, large proportions are not acquiring fundamental skills. UNESCO Institute for Statistics states the learning crisis where children who are unable to read and understand a simple text by age 10 as **Learning Poverty**.

As per 2018 ASER report, in India, about half of all children can read, and less than a third can do basic arithmetic. Many children completing Std VIII are unprepared for higher studies or for the labour market. Preparation for school, work, and life is needed by this stage.

One of the major challenges in the rural and tribal learning centers is the availability of qualified teaching resources. Qualified teachers leave the village or tribal hamlet for better prospects and learning centers end-up with hiring the unqualified resources.


Lack of funds and non-availability of regular training deprives quality education for the children. SaC is trying to bridge the gap by partnering with Vandematram Foundation, Kalwakurthy, Telangana.

Vandematram Foundation has developed pedagogy that helps the slow learners. It also provides training to government school teachers and tutors, who want to help the government school students.

SaC had identified tutors from the local resources, got them trained at Vandematram Foundation, and placed them at the learning centers. These tutors conduct regular classes in the learning centers with a focus on academic improvement.



Tutoring classes sponsored by SaC











Donor-Child Interaction' through web calls is one of our most unique features of the SaC Program of Sewa. If the learning center is a hostel or a residential school, donors can talk to their sponsored child on the First Saturday evening/Sunday morning (India Time) of the month through a WhatsApp web call. This year many donors have spoken to their sponsored students.



Children Development Activities

Our learning center children participate in both academic and non-academic activities. National festivals like Republic Day, Independence Day, and Gandhi Jayatnthi are celebrated. Also, birthdays of important personalities like Subhash Chandra Bose, and Dr. APJ. Abdul Kalam are celebrated.

Functions like Holi, Raksha Bandhan, Diwali, Ganesh Chaturthi, and other festivals are celebrated. For Ganesh Chathurthi, Ganesha idol is made using clay to inculcate the habit of using biodegradable products and understanding its impact on the environment.

Awareness camps like Health, Hygiene, and HIV Awareness, Personal and Public safety, and Career for Women in Armed Forces were conducted in schools that are supported by SaC.


