## **QUICK HIT NOTES**

- VCU sophomore Romana Kriskova kept up the pace on her record-breaking season. Kriskova now has 423 kills, sixth on VCU's all-time single-season top 10. She's averaging 4.75 kills per set this season, and could shatter VCU's school single season record of 4.46 kills per set.
- The Atlantic 10 is among the nation's best blocking conferences from a statistical point of view. The league has for teams ranked in the top 60 in the nation in blocking, Dayton, George Mason, VCU and Duquesne. Dayton (5th), Mason (13th) and VCU (27th) all reside in the top 30. The A-10 also has eight players ranked in the top 100 in blocking in the NCAA, led by Mason's Lolade Owokoniran, who is ninth nationally with 1.42 blocks per set.
- Duquesne and George Washington enter this week on multi-match winning streaks, having both won three straight. Both streaks are Conference games only.
- Three of the last five years have had an A-10 team finish with a perfect conference record, but it won't happen this season. When George Washington beat VCU on Saturday, the Colonials ensured that there would not be a perfect conference record this year. In the last five year, Dayton had a perfect A-10 mark in 2012 and 2010 and Saint Louis was unbeaten in league play in 2008.
- When the 2013 Atlantic 10 Volleyball Championship begins on Nov. 22 at George Washington, it will mark the first time in 22 years the Colonials have host the Championship. GW last hosted in the 1991 season. The Colonials have hosted three times overall, also welcoming the championship to DC in 1983 (the second-ever A-10 Championship) and 1989.

## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Shayne Brown | Dayton

Senior | Outside Hitter | Lakewood, Calif.

Brown led the Flyers to a split week with 4.00 kills per set, tallying double-digit kills in both matches. An outside hitter from Lakewood, Colo., she posted a match-high 13 kills while adding six digs and three blocks in Dayton's sweep of Fordham on Friday. On Sunday, Brown recorded her first career double-double with a career-high 19 kills and a career-high 13 digs at Rhode Island. She hit .267 for the week and averaged 2.38 digs per set while also recording four blocks.





## CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK Taylor Lockett | Duquesne


Sophomore | Middle Hitter | Golden Valley, Minn.

Lockett made the most of Duquesne's only match of the week, a 3-1 win over Saint Louis. She tallied a match-best eight blocks versus the Billikens, a 2.0 blocks per set average. The eight block assists also tied a career-high for the middle hitter from Golden Valley, Minn. Lockett also contributed to the offensive effort with five kills and a .364 hitting percentage.

## Janelle Sykes VCU

Junior | Middle Hitter | Clifton, Va.

Sykes averaged 1.77 blocks per set for VCU in a 2-1 week. The Clifton, Va., native had at least seven blocks in all three matches last week, including eight each against George Mason and George Washington. A middle hitter, she also had 19 kills for the Rams.

# ROOKIE OF THE WEEK Chidima Osuchukwu | George Washington Freshman | Middle Blocker | Virginia Beach, Va.

Osuchukwu was instrumental in a 2-0 week for GW that included a win over previously undefeated VCU. She hit .361 with 16 kills against just three errors while posting 14.0 blocks (2 solo, 12 assist). In Friday's 3-0 win over La Salle, Osuchukwu tallied six kills against one error and added three blocks (one solo, two assists). A middle blocker from Virginia Beach, Va., she followed that performance with 10 kills and a seasonhigh 11.0 rejections (one solo, 10 assists) on Saturday as the Colonials snapped the Rams' winning streak.
