Nivins earns his second career A-10

Player of the Week honor after averaging 19 points and 14 rebounds over two contests...scored 20 points and pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds in Saint Joseph's 77-64 win at Lehigh on Dec. 2...had a team-high 18 points and 11 boards on Dec. 6 versus Creighton...made 12-of-18 field goal attempts in the two games...leads the A-10 with five double-doubles on the year.



B.J. Raymond - Xavier

Senior, Guard, 6-6, 226 lbs.

Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit HS

In Xavier's lone contest of the week versus Auburn on Dec. 3, Raymond scored a career-high 32 points on 10-of-13 shooting and added six boards in the Musketeers' 81-74 victory...drained a career-best seven three-pointers in nine attempts...leads XU in scoring (13.7 ppg.).



### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Nicholson scored a season-high 16 points, grabbed nine rebounds and tied a program-record with eight blocks on Dec. 6 as St. Bonaventure downed Princeton, 60-53, in the Bonnies' lone contest of the week...made four-of-six shots from the field and 8-for-11 from the line, including all four of his foul shots in the final two minutes...is the first SBU student-athlete in program annals to earn three A-10 Rookie of the Week awards.

## A-10-SHUN

NEWS FROM AROUND THE ATLANTIC 10

**HONOR ROLL:** Charlotte junior guard **Ian Andersen** averaged 16.5 points and shot 10-of-21 from three-point range over two contests...senior forward **Charles Little** of Dayton averaged 12.5 points and seven rebounds while making 11-of-18 shots from the field in wins over Troy (87-70) and Akron (54-50)...Duquesne sophomore forward **Damian Saunders** scored 15 points and grabbed six rebounds at third-ranked Pittsburgh on Dec. 3...junior forward **Kimmani Barrett** of La Salle averaged 14.5 points and five rebounds in leading the Explorers to wins over Bucknell (68-65) and Hartford (70-64)...Massachusetts junior guard **Ricky Harris** netted a career-high 35 points on Dec. 6 in the Minutemen's 85-81 (OT) loss to Boston College...senior forward **Kahiem Seawright** of Rhode Island averaged 18.5 points, seven rebounds and two blocks over two games while making 16-of-22 shots from the field...Richmond junior guard **David Gonzalez** averaged 18.7 points and 6.3 rebounds while sinking nine three-pointers over three contests...senior guard **Kevin Lisch** of Saint Louis averaged 13.5 points and 3.5 steals in two games...Temple senior guard **Semaj Inge** poured in a career-best 19 points on Dec. 6 as the Owls' turned aside Penn State, 65-59.

**FLYING HIGH:** Dayton is 8-0 for the second time in head coach **Brian Gregory's** tenure at UD after the visiting Flyers edged Akron on Dec. 6, 54-50. In Gregory's first season at UD in 2003-04, the Flyers won their first nine games. Dayton has held each of its first eight opponents to under 40 percent shooting, including then-15th ranked Marquette in the finals of the Chicago Invitational Challenge on Nov. 29.

**X-CELLENT:** Xavier's 7-0 start is tied for the third-best start in program history and the best since its school-record 10-0 start of the 1996-97 season. The Musketeers are ranked 14th in the latest AP and ESPN/USA Today polls released on Dec. 1.

**PERFECT TEN:** Dayton and Xavier are vying to become the first A-10 programs to begin a season with 10 consecutive victories since Saint Joseph's opened the 2003-04 season with 27 straight wins.

**SWEET STROKE:** **Jimmy Baron** registered his third 20-point outing of the season on Nov. 29 with 23 points - including 11 in a row - in Rhode Island's 78-65 loss to #20/#22 Villanova. Baron earned All-Tournament honors at the Philly Hoop Group Classic and enters the Rams' Dec. 9 contest versus New Hampshire with 275 career three-pointers, including 14 career performances with at least five field goals from beyond the arc. The senior guard nailed eight three's at Duke on Nov. 16, the most by an opposing player in the history of Cameron Indoor Stadium.

**SLICK RICK:** Massachusetts junior guard **Ricky Harris** scored a career-high 35 points in the Minutemen's 85-81 (OT) loss to Boston College on Dec. 6. It marked the highest single-game performance by a UMass player since Marcus Camby poured in 38 points versus Dayton on Jan. 4, 1996. Harris and Xavier's **B.J. Raymond** are the only players in the A-10 to score at least 30 points in a game this season. A year ago, there were 21 30-point outings by 10 different players, led by Charlotte's Leemire Goldwire with six 30-point performances.

**ANYTIME, ANYWHERE:** According to RealTime RPI, the Atlantic 10 ranks fourth among Division I conferences in Strength Of Schedule. A-10 teams have already faced 11 ranked opponents since the season opened on Nov. 11.

**DANCING IN DAYTON:** Perhaps being fleet of foot is the secret to Dayton's 8-0 start to the season. Senior forward **Charles Little**, who led the Flyers with 17 points and 10 boards in their 87-70 win over Troy on Dec. 2, is in a ballet class this semester. Sophomore **Chris Wright**, the MVP of the Chicago Invitational Challenge who leads the team in scoring (13.6 ppg.) and rebounding (7.3 rpg.), is studying tap dance this term. "Tap is really difficult to do, but it pays off. After my ankle injury last year, it really helps with my flexibility and footwork," says Wright.

**DISH NETWORK:** Duquesne senior guard **Aaron Jackson** recorded a career-high 10 assists on Nov. 25 in the Dukes' 79-69 win at South Carolina-Upstate. Jackson has topped the 100-assist mark twice in his three previous seasons at Duquesne and leads the Conference with an average of 6.17 apg.

**MILLER TIME:** Xavier earned an 81-74 home win over Auburn on Dec. 4, giving head coach **Sean Miller** his 100th career victory. Now in his fifth season as head coach of the Musketeers, Miller boasts a career record of 100-39.

**STRAIGHT SHOOTER:** Saint Joseph's senior forward **Ahmad Nivins** seeks to join former George Washington standout Alexander Koul (1995-97) as the only players in A-10 history to lead the league in field goal percentage three consecutive years. Nivins shot .647 (165-of-255) from the field a year ago. The Jersey City, N.J., native has made 44-of-65 shots through the Hawks' first seven contests and leads the league with five double-doubles.

**SWIPING SPIDERS:** Richmond is averaging 7.5 steals per game through eight contests after amassing a season-high 12 in the Spiders' 76-66 win over Delaware State on Dec. 6. UR has recorded at least five steals in 40 of their last 42 games. Guards **David Gonzalez** and **Kevin Smith** share the team lead with 1.50 steals per game. Last season UR totaled 257 steals, just five shy of the school record.

**STREAKIN:** Dayton junior **Kurt Huelsman** has started every game of his collegiate career, a span of 73 consecutive contests thru games of Dec. 6, while Rhode Island's **Kahiem Seawright** leads the A-10 with 74 consecutive starts.

**SELECT COMPANY:** Temple senior guard **Dionte Christmas** averaged a league-best 19.7 points last season to become just the third player in Conference history to lead the Atlantic 10 in scoring in successive years. The two other players to hold that distinction are John Battle of Rutgers (1984-85) and St. Bonaventure's Earl Belcher (1980-81). Christmas is poised to become the first three-time scoring champion in Conference history. The Philadelphia, Pa., native is averaging 19.0 ppg. this season, good for second in the A-10. In addition, with eight career A-10 Player of the Week honors, Christmas trails only Xavier's David West (14), Jameer Nelson of Saint Joseph's (13) and Massachusetts' Marcus Camby (nine) for the most in league history.

**COMING OF AGE:** After averaging a modest 7.3 ppg. while ranking second in the A-10 in steals (1.79 spg.) last season, Rhode Island junior guard **Keith Cothran** has elevated his offensive game thus far in 2008-09. Cothran is averaging 15.8 ppg. and shooting 54.1 percent (57-of-109) from the floor. For his career, URI is 12-0 when Cothran scores 15 points or more. "Keith [Cothran] is the best slashing guard in the A-10," URI senior **Jimmy Baron** said.

**CHAMPIONSHIP CHATTER:** The Atlantic 10 Conference and CBS Sports announced a multi-year agreement for CBS to air the league's men's basketball championship final, beginning in 2010. The A-10 also announced a new format for the men's basketball championship to coincide with the 2010 title game being moved to Sunday on CBS Sports. The new format will continue to see the top 12 teams participate with seeds 1 through 4 receiving an opening round bye; however, the four opening round games will move to the campuses of the higher remaining seeded teams. Winners of each game will advance to the quarterfinals at a site scheduled to be announced later this winter for 2010 and beyond.

**PASSING THE ROCK:** Senior guard **Chris Lowe** of Massachusetts led the A-10 and ranked 13th nationally in assists (6.2 apg.) a year ago. The Mount Vernon, N.Y., native registered at least ten assists on six different occasions. By comparison, no other player in the Conference dished out ten or more assists in more than one game in 2007-08. Lowe, who also paced the A-10 in assists in 2006 (4.9 apg.), seeks to become the first player in league history to lead the Conference in assists three times. Carl Smith (UM - 1984, 86), Shandue McNeill (SBU - 1995, 97) and Jameer Nelson (SJU - 2001, 02) are the only other players to twice lead the A-10 in assists.

**A SLAM DUNK:** George Washington will face cross-town rival Maryland in the 14th Annual BB&T Classic at Washington's Verizon Center on Dec. 7. GW and Maryland co-host the event each year which has earned \$7 million over the last 13 years for the National Children's Charities Foundation of Washington, D.C.

**GOOD LINE, BAD LINE:** Dayton closed out its 60-59 (OT) win over Auburn on Nov. 28 by making its final 15 free throws of the game. The Flyers' shooting wasn't all perfect, however, as they set an NCAA record by missing all 24 of their three-point attempts. The previous record was an 0-for-22 effort by Canisius on Jan. 21, 1995 versus St. Bonaventure. The odds that a team who was making 39.5 percent of its three-pointers going 0-for-24 in a game are six-in-one-million, according to Texas Tech professor Dr. Alan Reifman, on his website <http://thehot-hand.blogspot.com/>.

**TESTING ITS METTLE:** La Salle improved to 4-3 after winning at Hartford on Dec. 6, 70-64. The Explorers' three losses have come to teams who are a combined 18-4.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Temple senior guard **Dionte Christmas** and junior forward **Derrick Brown** of Xavier are among 50 candidates for the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy.

**WINNING WAYS:** The **Atlantic 10** is tied (with Conference USA) for second nationally among Division I conferences with five active head coaches with 300 or more career victories. The ACC leads all Division I conferences with seven active head coaches with at least 300 career wins.

**WET BEHIND THE EARS:** Duquesne and Saint Louis will be among the youngest teams in the nation in 2008-09. Duquesne has eight scholarship freshmen and four sophomores on the 15-man roster. Three-year starter **Aaron Jackson** - the Dukes' lone senior - is also the team's only scholarship upperclassman. Saint Louis is the only other NCAA Division I school with eight scholarship freshmen and no school with more scholarship underclassmen than Duquesne's 11.

**MEN OF STEAL:** Charlotte enters its Dec. 10 contest at Mississippi State averaging 8.25 steals per game, good for second in the Conference. Junior **DiJuan Harris** leads the 49ers with 19 steals (2.38 spg.), including five versus Providence on Nov. 28. Last year, Charlotte registered 271 steals, its highest total since 1991.

**STEPPING UP:** UMass forward **Tony Gaffney** has opened his senior year in grand style. He has recorded four double-double performances - the first of his career - thru the Minutemen's first seven games - and blocked a career-best nine shots versus Boston College on Dec. 6. Gaffney leads the A-10 in rebounding with an average of 13.1 rpg.

**BEEN A WHILE:** St. Bonaventure hosted Mississippi State on Nov. 25, its first SEC clash since a 77-68 setback at Alabama in 2002. The last time an SEC program visited St. Bonaventure was Florida in 1977.

**FAST START:** **Ramone Moore** became the first Temple freshman to score double-figures in each of his first three collegiate games since Mardy Collins started his career by scoring in double figures in his first four Owl contests in 2003-04. Moore accomplished his feat coming off the bench while Collins started every game his freshman season.

**BENCH PRESS:** Dayton's bench outscored then-15th ranked Marquette by a 48-5 margin in the Flyers' 89-75 win in the finals of the Chicago Invitational Challenge on Nov. 29. UD has 11 different players averaging at least 10 minutes per game on the season.

**COOL UNDER PRESSURE:** George Washington improved to a staggering 103-5 in the last five seasons under head coach **Karl Hobbs** when leading at the five-minute mark of the second half after the Colonials' 70-64 win over UMBC on Nov. 26.

**FISH IN A BARREL:** Richmond shot 68.6 percent (35-for-51) from the field on Nov. 25 in its 85-74 win versus UMKC in the second round of the CBE Classic, the seventh-highest field goal percentage in A-10 history. The Spiders connected on 20-of-27 shots in the second half and finished the game missing just six shots (28-for-34) inside the three-point line. The league record for field goal percentage is .723 (34-of-47), set by Duquesne in 1991 versus St. Bonaventure.
