ELISE LANKIEWICZ, DAVIDSON

Lankiewicz, a three-time A-10 Women's Swimming & Diving Performer of the Year, participated in the NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships in 2017. She was named Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference and CSCAA Scholar All-American Honorable Mention for three consecutive years. Lankiewicz was twice named to the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll. A member of Beta Beta Beta, she also was a team captain at Davidson's Relay for Life event the past three years helping organize teammates and assisting in fundraising for the

event. Lankiewicz has also worked as a travel grant advisor for the Dean Rusk International Studies Program and served as a four-year member of Turner Eating House raising funds on behalf of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.

Wallerstedt previously qualified for the NCAA Preliminary Rounds in both 2014 and 2015. She was the A-10 Champion in the Discus at the 2015 Women's Outdoor Track & Field Championships and is a two-time All-Conference selection. She received Dean's List honors five semesters and was named to the CHSS President's List in the fall of 2015.

Bean, a member of the 2016 A-10 Women's Soccer All-Academic team, received 2nd Team All-Conference honors in 2016. Bean was named to the A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll five semesters and was named to the George Washington University Dean's List three times. Bascara, the 2017 La Salle University Female Scholar Athlete of the Year, was named Second Team All-Conference in 2015 and named to the All-Rookie team in 2014. She also received the Explorer Excellence Award for demonstrated leadership, character, sportsmanship and best exemplified values of their team. Bascara was a member of the Dean's List all four years and a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars along with being a member of Alpha Epsilon Delta, the pre-medical honor society. She has served as a lead researcher in the

Flagship Leader of Neurobiology Research Group, a tutor in Biology, Chemistry and Anatomy, along with volunteering as a softball coach for the Newtown Rock Softball Organization. Bascara has additionally volunteered at the St. Mary Medical Center along with several other local community groups and organizations.

KELSEY CRAWFORD, MASSACHUSETTSWomen's Track & Field | Houston, Texas Kinesiology



Crawford holds the school record for indoor shot put and the javelin, and ranks third all-time in the weight throw, outdoor shot put and heptathlon. An NCAA Championships qualifier in the javelin, she won the 2013 conference title in the heptathlon, is a four-time Atlantic 10 silver medalist (indoor shot put, outdoor shot put, javelin twice) and took home the 2017 A-10 bronze in the indoor shot put. A five-time New England Champion in the indoor and outdoor shot put and heptathlon, Crawford is a six time Dean's list and A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll selection. She served as a team captain for

three seasons and as a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). In 2016, she partook in a spring break trip called Camp for All 2U at MD Anderson Cancer Center, serving cancer patients who were unable to leave the hospital. She made the Universities Dean's list in the Fall of 2016 and was inducted into the National Society of Collegiate Scholar by the Pennsylvania State University Chapter in 2015. She was elected team captain to the Swim team for the 2016-17 season and scored the most points by anyone on the team in the 2016 A-10 Championship. She posted the fastest times in school history in the 200 I.M.,

and the 100 and 200 butterfly. She was a three-time individual medalist at the A-10 Championships and a two-time relay medalist in 2017, helping the Spiders to two A-10 Championship titles. Outside of her time as a student-athlete, she was an editor for The Odyssey Online, volunteered with Youth Life of Richmond and Express Swim America as a swim instructor.
