

This position reports directly to the Assistant Commissioner – Sport & Championship Administration. As a Championship team member, the position has responsibility for championship administration in designated sports. Additional responsibilities include Student-Athlete awards program and the conference Student-Athlete participation gift program.

Specific Responsibilities:

- > Championship Administration
 - Manage all aspects of designated Atlantic 10 Championships. Specific sport assignments to be determined (and are subject to change).
 - Serve as on-site secondary support staff for designated Olympic Championship events, plus women's and men's basketball "back of the house" management.
 - Operate within budgetary guidelines for each Olympic sport championship and work directly with host institutions on budgets for each championship event
 - o Provide parameters for host budgets
 - O Identify and account for all non-host related budget items in each championship budget
 - Work with the media relations staff to ensure that all championship related items are up
 to date and current on the website; have championship pages updated with all game
 times and ticket information once finalized.
 - Work with the media relations team to ensure that all live streaming requirements/standards are met for our Olympic Sport streams on ESPN+; help serve as quality control for the broadcast.

> Regular Season Responsibilities

- Develop and build conference competition schedules for designated sports.
- Update the A-10 Olympic Sport Policy Manual and all Championship related publications as designated (championship manuals, policy notifications, etc.).
- Coordinate sport committee meetings for designated sports and work with A-10 administrators in all areas of regular season and Championship event operations for each designated sport.

➤ General Duties

- Coordination of the conference Student-Athlete participant gift program, including budget management, gift selection, ordering/delivery and follow up surveys.
- Manage the relationship with and oversee the execution of the A-10 Awards Program (Jostens/MTM Recognition).
- >> Develop and cultivate positive working relations with internal and external constituents. Provide leadership in a professional manner while representing the conference and overseeing Championship events.
- > Complete and/or manage special projects and other duties as assigned.

The successful candidate will have excellent communication and problem-solving skills and the ability to work independently in a fast pace environment.
