



#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

All delegates and advisors are expected to display the appropriate mode of attire and behavior that is representative of any student leadership program.

- This conference is for student leaders in grades 8-12 and their faculty advisors.
- There must be one advisor present at all times for every twelve students in attendance.
- All delegates are expected to refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, and illegal drugs.
- The use of cell phones, video games, or head phones are prohibited at any meeting, activity, or general session.
- Students are not permitted to use any private vehicle.
- Students are not allowed to drive a vehicle to or from the conference.
- All student participants must be in their personal rooms from curfew to 6:00 am.
- Students must be housed in same gender rooms and are not allowed to be in opposite gender rooms at any time unless an advisor is present.
- Students will not be allowed to register without a registered advisor.
- Each delegate must complete all information and obtain the necessary signatures.
- All delegates and advisors are expected to wear their appropriate name badges throughout the conference.
- All delegates are expected to wear school colors on Sunday, November 21st.
- All delegates and advisors are expected to attend all conference sessions at the designated times.
- You must make your own arrangements if your student(s) need to share a room with student(s) from another school.
- Make travel arrangements to arrive no later than Sunday, November 21at 3:00 pm, and depart no earlier than Tuesday, November 23 at 12:00 noon.
- Advisors/chaperones must review and discuss the CLSA participation responsibilities with their student delegates to clearly define what is expected of them. Advisors must model the attire and behavior expected of their students and adhere to the rules and regulations as outlined below.
- Advisors/chaperones are expected to monitor their students during all events.

Students are expected to respect other students, advisors, presenters, speakers, guests, and hotel staff. They are expected to know that the following behaviors will not be tolerated at the conference: talking during presentations, interfering with anyone's ability to listen or participate, or creating a hostile or intimidating environment. Advisors must adhere to the rules and regulations as outlined above.



- Conference registration deadline is: October 15, 2010.
- Acceptance is on a first come, first serve basis.
- One advisor must be paid and registered for every twelve students. Each advisor is expected to attend all sessions and events.

• Registration cost per student and adult delegate: \$99.00 CLSA Members / \$125.00 Non-members
