### REFLECTION AND APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

**Monday:** Read Psalm 69:4 and John 15:20-27. Reflect on the fact that Jesus was rejected by God so that those who reject Him (including us) could be accepted by Him.

**Tuesday:** Read Psalm 69:9 and John 2:13-17. Not long after Jesus “cleansed the Temple,” His zeal for God provided ultimate cleansing and a clear path to the Father for all. Praise God for His gracious provision and inclusiveness in Christ.

**Wednesday:** Read Psalm 69:9 and Romans 15:3. “Reproach” refers to “disapproval” or “disappointment.” People who express reproach for God will do the same for His followers (like David and ultimately Christ). Take heart in these moments that believers and Christ can relate to you. Find the strength to stay strong in the fact that Christ bore the ultimate reproach of God on the cross so that we don’t have to!

**Thursday:** Read Psalm 69:1-4. Do you, like David and Christ, have people who “hate [you] without cause”? While it’s not fair or right, neither was it fair or right for Christ, the perfect man, to die a shameful, slave’s death on the cross. Thank God for this ultimate act of unfairness and pray blessings and love over your enemies.

**Friday:** Read Psalm 69:34-36. Praise God for our future hope!
