

Luke 24 Sermon Reflection Questions

Observe & Interpret

Read: Luke 24. Summarize the passages in your own words.

- 1. Who were the first ones to enter the empty tomb and tell the apostles about it(v.8-10)? Why was this significant? How does this speak to the legitimacy of the event?
- 2. What happened on the road to Emmaus(v.13-35)? How does the encounter with Jesus enhance our understanding of God and His prophets?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus asks the disciples for something to eat in verse 43? How does this act help confirm His physical resurrection?
- 4. Observe and interpret Jesus' final commission in verses 44-49.

Apply

Verse 45 says that Jesus opened the minds of the disciples to the scriptures. In other words, He helped them understand the scriptures. Jesus obviously has a very high regard for scripture. Do you? Do you believe that God can open your eyes to the truth of scripture?

How does the resurrection shape your perspective on the promises of God?

Prayerfully determine the main biblical truth or principle that God revealed to you during your study. A few questions to ask are: Do I believe in the bodily resurrection of Jesus? Do I hold scripture in high regard like Jesus? How many non-Christians have I shared the death and resurrection of Jesus with?

Memorize: Luke 24:44 "He said to them, 'This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about Me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms."
